Pastor's Pen

In our congregational vision to "Know the Father, Grow as disciples of Jesus, and Go with the Spirit", we have identified the essential relationships we are to have in our lives with our Triune God - Father, Son, and Holy Spirit - and with each other, as fellow believers. We have also highlighted the primary task we have been given as the Church, to go into the world and make disciples. In order to move forward in fulfilling of our vision, it is essential that we set priorities and develop disciplines that will strengthen those relationships and enable us to be effective in our calling. Keep that in mind as we look at what will be happening in the coming weeks.

This month, as mentioned in last month's newsletter, our new Sunday morning schedule begins. Starting on August 20, our schedule will include Traditional Worship at 8:30 am and Contemporary Worship at 11:00. Between services on that day (9:45 - 10:45) in the Carter facility, our Director of Children & Family Ministry, Elizabeth Hill, will be holding a "Kickoff Party" for all of our St. Tim's Kids (ages 3 through 5th Grade) and their parents. Materials for classes, opportunity to meet teachers, and a high energy celebration are all part of what will be available that day. During that same 9:45 hour, Anna-Marie Valles (Junior High Ministry) and Joe Hill (Senior High Ministry) will be gathering in our Youth House with our Junior and Senior High students for the start of our new "Sunday Café." In addition, in the Fellowship Hall and around campus, along with food and fellowship, there will be opportunity for all of us to learn more about ways to connect and become involved in the life of our congregation.

The following **Sunday, August 27, during the 9:45-10:45 "Middle Hour"**, opportunities for learning and growth, in the spirit of Christian fellowship, will begin. St. Tim's Kids (preschool through 5th Grade) will meet in the Carter facility, Junior and Senior High "Sunday Café" will meet in the Youth House, and two opportunities, in the Fellowship Hall, will be available for our adult followers. The first adult learning opportunity will parallel the curriculum used in our St. Tim's Kids and our Junior & Senior High Sunday Café. Written by Randy Frazee, **a study titled "Believe"** will dig into what it means for us to "Think, Act, and Be" like Jesus. Broken into three 10-week sessions, this study will provide opportunity for parents to be growing in the same ways as their children. The second learning opportunity will be a study in **the life and teachings of Martin Luther**. In this 500th Anniversary year of the Protestant Reformation, this study will lift up some of the history and biblical truths that are foundational to us as Lutheran Christians.

Finally, as we move into this new school-year schedule, I challenge each of you to consider becoming involved in one of our **"Grow Groups."** Last August, we started with just over 80 of our adults in this small-group discipling effort. By year-end, more than 120 adults were involved. Without exception, the response was overwhelming and the result was significant. Be watching for specific times and days when these groups will meet, and be praying about how you might rearrange your schedule to include this smaller group opportunity for fellowship, encouragement, and growth.

Speaking not only for myself, but for Pastor Jonna and Pastor Brian, along with our entire church staff and Leadership Team, I strongly encourage you, starting on Kickoff Sunday, to make a two-hour Sunday morning commitment to worship and spiritual growth, and find a way to become involved in one of our midweek Grow Groups. Foundational to our faith is a commitment to regular worship and essential to our spiritual growth is a desire to be in fellowship with other believers around God's Word.

I am excited about the Vision God has given us and even more excited about what it will mean for us as it takes shape. I look forward to "Kicking Off" a new year in just a few short weeks, as we "Know, Grow, and Go" together.

St. Timothy's Endowment Fund Scholarship

One of the tasks allotted to the Finance Team is overseeing the St. Timothy's Endowment Fund. This Fund is separate from the church budget and was set up to support mission and ministry projects important to St. Timothy's vision. Money for the fund comes from donations from the congregation. These donations are then invested, and it is the income earned from the investments that is used to provide financial support for the mission needs.

This year, the Finance Team decided to provide a scholarship from the Endowment Fund to support a graduating high school senior who will be attending a 4-year school in the fall. After the scholarship was announced, a congregation member offered to provide additional funds to increase the amount of money available. As a result, we were able to provide three scholarships.

All three of the recipients are active members of St. Timothy's – involved as leaders in worship, VBS, Sunday school, and the Mexico Mission Trip. As part of the application process, the applicants had to write a short essay about how St. Timothy's helped shape their faith. All three wrote heartfelt essays that are a testament to the impact St. Timothy's community of believers had on their spiritual growth.

The scholarship recipients are:

Kirsten Sapp - attending Sonoma State University to study Children's Psychology

"Freshman year of high school I lost my grandpa. It was a really tough time for me as I really had not experienced losing someone I loved before. My family continued to go to church and I joined every Sunday even though it was tempting to turn around and blame God for everything. Going to church instead of caving into temptation helped so much and I was able to take bits and pieces out of sermons and instead of the death of my grandfather belittling my faith, the event grew my faith more than ever."

Joseph Porter – attending Colorado State University, Fort Collins to study Geology

"I have become significantly more involved in the church community to continue enhancing and expanding my relationship with God and others, teaching in the JK-K Sunday School program for the past two years. I have thoroughly

enjoyed watching the children grow in spirit, and even teach me a lesson or two! I will definitely miss them, and I can't wait to see where their relationship with God takes them."

Zoe Stamos – attending Chico State University to study Psychology and Musical Theater "In the midst of this journey I went on the Mexico Mission Trip for the first time. The thing that I most took away from that trip was that I couldn't let my love for God be contingent upon how good my life was. These people were worshipping God in the midst of despair, and finding his grace in every moment. It was aweinspiring, and I wanted to live more like them. It helped me to approach my own difficulties with a different mindset, understanding now that sometimes the greatest blessing is suffering."

It is a simple process to sign up:

1st go to our church website and click on the VH banner (it looks just like the one above)

2nd you are now at the Overview and Sign up page. Before moving on, please read this page. Here you will see the types of jobs you can sign up for as well as learning about security clearances necessary. When finished, please click on the SIGN UP AS A VOLUNTEER button.

3rd you are now at the SignUp.com site. Please register by providing your name and email address. Once registered, start exploring the site. You will see a listing for positions needed to be filled. Click on the + button to expand the job description. Below is an example. It tells you the job title, job description, time and day it is taking place, if it is a one-time job or recurring, how many people are required and if there are spaces available or if the position is filled.

1. Unload cots, lockers, bedding and personal belongings and set up in assigned spaces on transfer day.

2. Follow guest bedding layout plan for set up of cots.

3. Set up lockers in number sequence in locker area.
