Dear Friends at St. Timothy's Lutheran Church,

My younger sister, Karin, has a special gift. After attending Bible college for one year in Vancouver, Canada, twelve friends came down to Fresno to visit her. Karin has the gift of friendship.

Karin was a kind of pied piper – people would follow her anywhere, no matter the distance. The love and affection she showed to her friends I have rarely seen. (When you meet my sister, you will love her too.)

What was it that drew such a dramatic response in her friends, that they would travel great distances to see her, I wondered? I began to pay close attention. She didn't often initiate the phone call or the visit or the letter, but she listened. She would stay up late, seemingly unaware of the time, talking about life and faith with her friends. One quality baffled me more than any other.

You need your friends, I told her. Karin was surprised by my analysis, and chuckled. What I mean is, you need your friends, and they know you need them. You allow yourself to be vulnerable to your friends so that they are not "nice additions" to your life; they are necessary to your life. That is not how I view my friendships. My friends are "nice additions." I don't want to need anyone.

This mentality of course is not altogether unhelpful. The desire to not need anyone motivates us to move out of mom and dad's house, to pursue careers, to take care of ourselves, to be stable, to relieve people from one more obligation.

This desire also has its downsides. We don't know when to ask for help; we refuse to accept help when we need it; and we don't know how to love one another, recognizing that their presence is something we need.

This is true of our spiritual lives. We need each other. We were not meant to do this alone, nor can we. I can't do it alone and neither can you. We can't do it alone.

I would like to encourage you to be involved in our community, knowing that we need you and you need us. Worship with us on Sunday mornings; join us for our Middle Hour opportunities; be a part of a Grow Group; serve with us at Village House. Wherever God is leading you to be involved, please join us! I look forward to seeing where God leads us together.

This school year our theme verse is 1 John 3:1a "See what love the father has lavished on us that we should be called children of God; and so we are." The following is the devotion that we used to kick off the school year with the teachers and staff.

Hi! My name is Gayle and I'm a child of God.

There are things about God that will take us an eternity to understand, but God's love for us was never supposed to be one of them. John emphatically tells us that God's love for us is proven in the fact that God calls us His children. John even punctuates the fact with the phrase, "And that is what we are!"

So, what exactly does it mean to be a child of God? What exactly is this identity we have in Christ Jesus? There are 3 things that happen when you become a child of God.

We are adopted by God — When you become a child of God, you are adopted. You may not have a good human father, but God is a perfect Father. He loves you no matter what. Nothing you do will change God's love for you. Sin can hurt your relationship with God, but even if you sin you are still God's child. God's forgiving love is shown in the parable of "The Prodigal Son."

You begin to Reflect God's Image — Children are often a reflection of their parents, in looks and in learned behavior. Since we are children of God, our heavenly Father is the perfect role model. As a child of God, you represent the family of God. When you become a child of God, you'll begin to reflect God's image. You can give others an impression of God by your actions and words.

You are a member of God's family – There is a connection once you become a child of God; you become a brother or sister. You are a member of the Body of Christ. God designed us to be connected to one another; to live in community; to support one another.

Can you imagine what our life would be like if we really believed that? How different would our families operate if we really believed that everyone under our roof was seriously God's child? How different would St. Tim's be if we came to school every day with the full assurance that we are children of God? How different would we approach the challenges that come our way? The truth is most of us wrestle with the concept of being God's child. We have no clue as to what it means or how it should affect our life.

So this year we will wrestle together. We will grow together. We will live in community. We will be brothers and sisters in Christ!

In Memory of Pastor Richard Andersen August 23, 1931 – April 16, 2017

We recently became aware of the fact that one of our former pastors, Richard Andersen, was called home to be eternally with the Lord on Easter Sunday, April 16, 2017. Pastor Andersen served St. Timothy's from 1986 – 1993. He was a graduate of Trinity Theological Seminary in Dubuque, Iowa and he later earned his Ph.D. at California School of Theology in Glendale, California. Throughout his ministry, Pastor Andersen served congregations in North Hollywood, Ojai, Rancho Cordova, La Habra, Long Beach and San Jose. He was an accomplished author and preacher and a gift to Christ's Church. He is survived by his wife, Lois, who is currently living in Sierra Vista, Arizona. To God alone be the glory for the memory of one of his faithful servants.

Village House comes to St. Timothy's September 6th - October 4th

Welcome our Children and Families to Worship!

At this point, our new schedule is under way and St. Tim's KIDS is off to a great start. One of my favorite things about our new schedule is that children and families are encouraged to be in worship together every single week (not just on Family First Sundays). So it begs the common question, "Why? Church services are for adults - What do my kids even get out of it?"

- 1. They are SEEN. According to Fuller Youth Institute, a "sticky faith" forms as children form meaningful relationships with Christian adults who aren't their parents. Research also shows that one of the most meaningful things for young children is that someone knows their name. When children are in church, they are seen and other people learn their names. Encourage your kids to participate in the "greet your neighbor" time and shake hands with the adults who sit in the pews around you!
- They get to SEE. Kids learn by watching and imitating. In worship, children see Bibles being opened, choirs singing, prayers being said, offerings being given, communion being shared. Over time, they begin to ask questions, learn, and appreciate the importance of each of these things.
- 3. They EXPERIENCE. Corporate worship is a powerful expression of God coming to us and then, in response, us turning to God in praise. In worship, children experience worship with all their senses. Have you ever heard it said that "children's mind are like sponges?" They absorb everything! Even when it doesn't always seem like it, they are listening and absorbing what's happening around them.

Parents, bringing your children into church can be daunting and, yes, sometimes they are disruptive. But we, as a congregation, will strive to embrace children in worship - distractions and all - because they are just as much a part of our family as anyone else. Children are not just the future of the church, they are the present. So let's encourage them to be present!

(And, don't forget - pick up a "Busy Bag" and children's bulletin to help them follow along & stay engaged throughout the service!)


