

#### Pastor's Pen

Last year, in January 2016, at our Annual Meeting, the congregation elected a Call Committee whose task was to search for and, ultimately, to recommend a candidate to join our pastoral staff at St. Timothy's. Pastor Judy had already announced her planned retirement, no later than May 2017. As a result, the Call Committee was formed and the search for our next pastor began and has, since, taken place.

On February 12, 2017, after twelve months of hard work and prayer, a Special Meeting of the congregation was held to hear a report and recommendation from the Call Committee to extend a Letter of Call to Pastor Brian Zaas. After hearing a report from the Call Committee and why they were convinced that God had led them to Pastor Brian, and he to us, the result was an overwhelmingly positive response to extend a call for him to join our pastoral staff. The Letter of Call has since been sent and Pastor Brian has up to 30 days to respond. I encourage your prayers for him and his wife, Debi, as they consider the call to serve in our faith community.

Along with the work that led the Call Committee to recommend Pastor Brian, they have also been tasked with searching for a third pastor to join our pastoral team. At the Annual Meeting in January, the congregation voted to move forward with a proposal to expand our pastoral staff to include two new pastors who will join me on our staff. The proposal included thoughts on building a pastoral team that would enable us to expand our mission work immediately, prepare and position us for the future, and enable us to more effectively reach the next generations for Jesus. Although those results are not fully ours to control, they are goals toward which we will be working as decisions are made and as the pastoral team is put into place. Again, be praying for our Call Team as they are well on their way toward recommending a candidate to complete our pastoral staff.

With all of this in mind, let us not forget that at some point in the near future we will be celebrating the ministry of Pastor Judy who has served us faithfully for the past ten years. As already stated, she will soon be stepping away from her position on our staff. As soon as that date becomes more certain, we will be scheduling a time to celebrate all that she has offered to us as she has served her Lord Jesus. Until then, use every opportunity to thank Pastor Judy for her work and to pray for her transition into retirement. She has been a gift to me and has become a true and dear friend and we, as a congregation, have been blessed by her ministry.

Pastoral transitions in congregations are rarely easy. Over time, friendships form, lives are shared, and partnership in ministry takes place. As a result, those transitions, oftentimes, carry an element of sadness. In this case, when it happens, Pastor Judy will be missed. Those same transitions are also opportunities for new friendships to be formed, new ministry partnerships to develop, and new chapters to begin.

As Pastor Judy steps away and as a new pastor (or pastors) join our staff, certain truths never change. We serve the same Lord Jesus. We are cared for by the same Heavenly Father. We are led by the same Holy Spirit. It is in that confidence and with that assurance that I look forward to these transitions as we continue to trust and believe in the same One True God.

Update on the Ekka Family and ministry



As the Ekka family continues their home leave year in St Paul, they are moving ahead with plans to build a Christian Boarding School for children (K-12) in India. They also report that their 76 students are on internship before graduation and ordination. They share their concern that the Indian Government is making it increasingly difficult for Christian organizations to fulfill their ministry, cancelling international bank accounts, and thus effectively shutting down the ministry of Compassion International India.

Continue to pray for Pastors Neeraj and Nijhar and their family; the planning and building of the Christian Boarding School; for the seminarians as they prepare for ordained ministry; for more than 100,000 children and families affected by the discontinuation of the Compassion India program; and for the many Christian ministries affected by the new international bank account policy. March — April


March 12-19: Finish "Seeking Allah; Finding Jesus." It's never too late to join this class.

March 26, April 9: "Focus on the Crucifixion and Resurrection of Jesus"

Most of the Gospel narratives focus on Jesus' ministry – a short span of three years. Did you know that of those three years, nearly 1/3 of the Gospels focus on one week (which we now call Holy Week)? What is it about the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus that is so important to Christians – and has changed the world?

- March 26: Philip Yancey, journalist and lay theologian, shares his insights through clips from several movies about Jesus' life and death.
- April 9: Bishop N.T. Wright offers a rather surprising (but not new) view of the Resurrection, and what it means for you and me today.

Beginning April 23: "Bonhoeffer: Pastor, Martyr, Prophet, Spy:" a 4-week series. What led this young, German pastor (a pacifist) to stand up against Hitler in his search for truth and discipleship? Pastor Bonhoeffer died at the age of 39 in a concentration camp just weeks before the Americans liberated the camps. What kind of faith led to his untimely death? And what does it mean for you and me today?



# From the School

"This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you."

John 15:12 is our theme verse this year at St. Timothy's Christian Academy. One of the ways that we show Jesus' love to others is by serving others. So here at St. Tim's we talk with even our little students about serving others. For young children, who still so often and naturally, think about themselves, it can be challenging to teach them how to serve a friend. It is easy to talk about what it means to share Jesus love by serving others. However, children learn best by doing, experiencing. To make lasting change in the lives of our students, we must give them opportunities to be servants to others.

In a few weeks our students (preschool and elementary) will be putting Jesus' command into action. On March 15th we will hold our first annual serve-a-thon. Our students will be working with their "Chapel Buddies" to serve others in our community. They will be assembling "Blessing Bags" to be distributed by the Mercy Mobile. They will also be decorating placemats and lunch bags for use when St. Timothy's hosts the Village House: An Interfaith Shelter of Hope. When I see a young child put the needs of another before themselves, or kindly help a friend, I see first-hand that Christ is at work in their lives. Please pray for our serve-a-thon, that our students will grow, as disciples of Jesus, and that lives in our community will be transformed in the name of Jesus.




