Pastor's Pen 500th Anniversary of the Reformation: Celebrating Christ!

Dear Brothers and Sisters at St. Timothy's Lutheran Church,

What a blessing it is for our pastoral and ministry staff to prepare and launch the Confirmation program for our 8th graders and the First Communion classes for our 5th graders as we move into October and through our Fall season. Each of the classes provide us the opportunity to encourage our students as they grow spiritually and proclaim their faith in Christ through Word and Sacrament. What a special year to be journeying with these students as they explore their faith in light of the catechism as it has been handed down since the time of Reformation.

This month, our congregation will join with other Protestant churches across the world to celebrate the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation. After 500 years, the focus of our celebration remains the same – our focus is ALL about JESUS! As Lutherans, we may need to remind ourselves that this Reformation anniversary is not a celebration of Luther. As a Lutheran church, we will reflect on Luther's teachings to rejoice in the fundamentals of our faith remaining anchored in Christ himself: the Lord's Supper, Holy Baptism, the Greatest Commandment, the Great Commission, and extending further into all the areas covered in our catechism (the Ten Commandments, the Lord's Prayer, the Creeds, Confession and Forgiveness).

Luther reformed the church by centering the church once again on the truth of Scripture and the Lordship of Christ. His teachings and those carried forward from the time of Reformation to today, were expressed in three "solas" — Sola gratia ("by grace alone"), sola fide ("by faith alone"), and sola scriptura ('by Scripture alone"). We find in these solas our foundational understanding of Reformation theology anchored in God's love for His people and reflected in solus Christus ("through Christ alone").

By grace alone means that God gives His love freely. We cannot earn God's love. We cannot earn forgiveness. Our human efforts do not earn us God's favor. By faith alone means that those of us who believe in Jesus as God's Savior will receive forgiveness and eternal life. Faith is something God gives to people through His Holy Spirit, working in the Word of God and the Sacraments of Holy Baptism and the Lord's Supper. By Scripture alone means that God has revealed His truth through the Holy Bible.

Luther insisted that the Church recognize that Scripture is the one trustworthy source for the truth about God, our church doctrine, theology and our lives. We must properly read the Old and New Testaments in light of Jesus as the Son of God in the flesh. The Bible teaches that His death and resurrection is the key event in all of history, because

there, Jesus died to gain the forgiveness of everyone's sins.

The celebration of the 500th anniversary of the Reformation is a time for us to return to the basics —when we return to the Word and Sacraments, when we turn to Christ and His love. Luther shared the basics in the Small Catechism for the instruction of laypeople, like us. Luther intended us to use the Small Catechism at St. Tim's and in our homes to instruct children in the faith and to reinforce the faith in the hearts and minds of our adults. There is no better time than in this year of the 500th anniversary of the Reformation for each of us to revisit the catechism. Review it for ourselves. Refresh the teachings in our minds. Pray the catechism daily to share our hearts.

We can sum up the Reformation in a brief statement from Luther: "I must listen to the Gospel. It tells me, not what I must do, but what Jesus Christ, the Son of God, has done for me" (Commentary on the Epistle to the Galatians, Chapter 2). Because of Jesus, God turns towards us in love. God forgives us through Christ. After His death on the cross, Jesus rose from the dead. He conquered death for all those who believe in Him.

As Lutherans, we must renew our focus in God's Word and Sacraments as the focal point for our celebration — our communion with Christ. In 2 Corinthians 13:14, Paul reminds us "may the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all."

> Rejoice as we renew our focus on God's love, Christ's sacrificial death and resurrection, and ultimately the Holy Spirit's active engagement in our lives. **Scripture**. Given by God. Through which we receive Christ. **Grace**. Given by

> > God. Through which we receive Christ. **Faith**. Given by God. Through which we receive Christ. Through **Christ alone**. God gives us all these gifts because of Jesus' death and resurrection. All good gifts come from God and bless all those who believe. 500 years later keep it simple; go back to the basics — Through Christ, In Christ, and For Christ alone!

A real-life prince visited the students of St. Timothy's Christian Academy during Chapel. It was a grand event, complete with drums, trumpets, and a spectacular fanfare to herald his imperial arrival. The children knew that they were in the presence of someone who holds a special place in the world.

For you see, this prince is no ordinary

prince. This prince is descended from the most ancient and powerful of royal bloodlines, and is heir to the most influential and well-established kingdom of all time. This prince, ladies and gentlemen, is our very own Pastor Brian Zaas.

Yes, Prince Zaas (in crown and cape) added another layer to our student's understanding of what it means to be a child of God. Our theme verse for the school year is 1 John 3:1: "See what great love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called the children of God!" And that is what we are! We wanted to set the stage for our students to imagine what it means to have a royal identity in Christ. 1 Peter 2:9 says, "For you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation..." and at the end of our special guest's regal visit, he bestowed a crown upon each of our students, as a reminder that, as children of God, they are royal, too.

There was a time when I might have questioned this teaching approach. In my former attempt to encourage humiity in my students, I would have raced over the "you are the light of the world" parts, and spent most of my time on the, "so act like this..." parts. It always seemed a little risky to focus on the high position God's children held in His Kingdom, believing there was too much egocentricity in the world already. I figured it would be far more beneficial to the public to remind our youngsters (and spouses, coworkers, the guy in the car next to us) that they are, in fact, not the center of the universe, and would do well to sit down, be humble (If I may quote Kendrick).

Yet, after looking more closely at scripture, I found that God goes out of His way to elevate the identity of His children. Our verse of the year says He lavishes love on us, and tells us repeatedly that we are His own. Well before we did anything to deserve it. We know that we don't become children of God by earning the position. We know that our Father in Heaven doesn't wait for us to act like a prince or princess before He gives us the title. As a matter of fact, the grace of God works in reverse. It's only after we identify ourselves as His children that we can begin to behave like one; gracious, confident, humble, generous, mighty, heirs to the Kingdom. Identity always precedes activity.

Now I strive to remind people who they are, myself included. I've even entertained the idea of carrying around a crown in case of an emergency. Picture this: the next time your child, spouse, coworker, or the guy in the car next to you, starts acting 'the fool,' instead of your usual response, pull out a crown, plop it on your head, and just stand there. Or better yet, pull out two crowns, one for you and one for the 'fool' in question. Ok, probably not a good idea. But what would it change in you to imagine a crown on the head of your child, spouse, or the guy in the car next to you? What would change to imagine a crown on your own head? (And don't forget the fanfare of trumpets and drums.) How would our behaviors and attitudes change if we were thus reminded of our God-given identity and the God-given identity of others? That we were, even now, in the presence of royalty? We might even tremble.
