

## Pastor's Pen

As we turn the calendar page to the month of November, we will have just celebrated the 500<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the beginning of the Protestant Reformation. It was a reforming movement that brought the Church back to its central focus on God's Word as our sole authority, and to the saving message of Jesus Christ, crucified and risen, as our primary witness to the world. We have a tremendous heritage as a church. We also have an important message to share.

One of the important theological truths renewed as a result of the Reformation, was the proper distinction between our faith and our works. We are **not**, as the Reformers well knew, an *"if, then"* people. *If* we do certain things, *then* God will love us. That is not the "Good News" of the gospel. What we are, is a *"because, therefore"* people. *Because* God loves us, *therefore* we respond in a life of good works. Our good works *do not save us*, but we do good works because we have *already been saved* in Christ.

This month we have a number of very direct ways to respond to God's saving love. At our annual **Fall Fellowship** on Sunday, November 12 from 4:30 – 7:00 pm, we will pack and prepare shoeboxes to be given to Operation Christmas Child. The evening includes a shoebox packing party, a potluck dinner, and a time of fellowship and fun. It is a wonderful opportunity to respond to God's love, share Christian fellowship with others in your church family, and to invite a friend.

Our annual **Thank Offering celebration is set for Sunday**, **November 19**. That morning, we encourage you to bring canned and packaged foods to worship. These gifts will be used in our own FISH Food Pantry, as well as being passed on to other food distribution ministries in the area. Also, that same morning, we are partnering with City Team Ministries to collect frozen turkeys to be distributed to people in need. Bins for the turkey collection will be available in the church entryway.

A third opportunity for giving thanks and responding to God's love is at our **Thanksgiving Eve worship service on Wednesday, November 22 at 7:00 pm.** If you are in town for the holiday, I encourage you to make time for worship. It is one of the clearest and most important ways for us to show and to give thanks to God.

Finally, this month, we also make our stewardship commitments for 2018. You will soon be receiving a packet of materials through which you can make your commitments for the coming year. As in years past, we are asking all our members to commit to regular worship attendance and to financially support the work we share as a congregation. Regular worship is essential to our growth and life, individually, and as a congregation. It is the one place where we gather to hear God's Word and where God promises to work through his Holy Spirit to create faith. And our financial support is crucial to enabling us to be faithful in the work we have been given. The biblical standard of a tithe (10% of our income) is where we are to start. God promises to bless our lives as we step out in faith in response to what he has done. Opportunity will be given on November 19, 26, and December 3, during our morning worship, to make your 2018 commitments.

We have been blessed tremendously by God. We are who we are because of his love and grace. In response, we offer what we have in return, reach out to those in need, and bear witness to the gospel through word and deed. I look forward to responding with you, once again, to what God has done for us.

By all accounts, Pearce should be dead.

acquired so many near death experiences that an awed hush followed him throughout the neighborhood. Awe and fear. Parents up and down the block were tempted to preemptively ground their children if they glimpsed the shirtless, barefoot Pearce riding his bike toward the front door. Don't get me wrong – we all loved Pearce. He was one of those sunny kids who made everyone feel good about themselves. He was unafraid to love, and unafraid to make use of whatever was in front of him. Pearce never wasted anything; not a moment, not a smooth stone, not an idea. To him it was as if the presence of the creek cliff, a bit of driftwood, and a bit of rope was a dare. A smiling challenge from heaven to put to good use what God had put right in front of him. And Pearce took the dare, every time.

Pearce came to mind when I began pondering what thankfulness *looks* like. He's clearly no role model when it comes to using reason and seeking wise counsel, but I wondered if being thankful for all I have should look a little more like *taking the dare*. If I am truly grateful for all that God has blessed me with, what better way to show it than to put it to good use? I know the tendency of my own heart is to cling to any treasure God entrusts me with (monetary blessing, talent, spiritual blessing) as if He'll never give me another. I'll go into scarcity-mindset and "keep it like a Kaiser." (shout out to Red Hot Chili Peppers). But Jesus warns us about this in the parable of the talents (Matthew 25). He is looking for servants who will not only put to use what the master gives, but to put it to *bold* use. Maybe even use that requires a little bravery.

During this season of thanks, I am challenging myself to take the dare; to look at the things I have been blessed with, and show God how grateful I am for it by putting it to bold use. Not because He requires it – He is faithful and generous no matter what I do – but because He put it in my hand to be used. I'm not sure what taking the dare will look like yet. But I imagine it will look less like a quiet nod during worship service, or a polite mention around the turkey, and more like abundant living, passionate worship, deep generosity, and a more engaged investment of my time, talent, and treasure. It will require that I'm more aware of what I have, and of the needs around me. Above all, it will require that I trust God more, and trust myself less. Which is what growth is really all about, right?

And so I pass the dare along to my fellow believers. Perhaps we can all be a little more like Pearce this thanksgiving... only spiritually... and wearing a helmet.


Sandwiches and salad provided by Brookdale Senior Living. Dessert and beverages will also be provided. No charge for this event.
