

Dear Brothers and Sisters at St. Timothy's Lutheran Church,

This year as we begin our Lenten season, Ash Wednesday and Valentine's Day fall on the same day. Do you wonder how these two observances can offer any common ground in understanding our Christian walk? For many of us, Valentine's Day has become a somewhat superficial and commercialized holiday; however, this day can offer a great opportunity to encourage the affirming of relationships we have with our loved ones. Lent is a more somber occasion calling for repentance and forgiveness of sins. While these two observances may seem to have little relationship to one another, they do share something in common as the holidays come together on the calendar.

Both deal with the measures of our hearts and ultimately reflect the love we have — for one another and for God. On Valentine's Day, we celebrate the love we share in those special relationships with spouses, family and friends. Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent and defines the tone of the Lenten season leading up to Maundy Thursday. Ash Wednesday and Lent point us to the greatest act of love, when Jesus Christ gave up His life on the cross that we might be forgiven and live.

During our Ash Wednesday service, ashes are placed on our foreheads in the shape of a cross. Throughout the stories of the Bible, ashes have long been an outward sign of repentance. And, in the New Testament, we are given the cross as a beacon of hope for all believers through which we obtain the forgiveness of our sins. The ashes we

receive on our foreheads serve as a reminder of the mortality of our sinful nature and the redemption of Christ into which we, His followers, have been baptized.

Jesus showed his love for us on the cross by dying to take away our sins. It was on that cross, Jesus prayed for the Roman soldiers, while they were executing Him: "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do" (Luke 23:34). When Jesus prayed, He did not have ashes on His head. Rather, He wore a crown of thorns and a cross upon His back. He wore them for each of our sins!

Lent is a time for meditating on the passion of Christ and guiding our hearts and minds toward the rejoicing that comes with Easter. We can live out our daily Christian walk as disciples seeking to destroy our sinful nature as we move ahead in the spirit of prayerful remorse and repentance. We transform our hearts when we seek the Lord in our meditation and quiet time reflecting on His Word. We intentionally strengthen our focus on our renewed faith and life in Christ.

In taking these strides, we never view repentance as the product of human wisdom, reason, strength, or effort. Rather, we always see the path to repentance that lies ahead as the divine work of the Holy Spirit revealed to us through God's Word and forgiven and reformed in His Gospel. God's Word crucifies our natural human response toward sin, and then Christ reconciles and restores us to His divine nature.

As we come together to reflect our love for one another over Valentine's Day and engage through Lent to demonstrate our love for the Lord from Ash Wednesday

through Holy Week, we rejoice as we celebrate the gift of love. We can remember and give thanks to God for the greatest gift of love in His Son, Jesus Christ. We can love others as He has loved us.

Over the next few weeks, we will preach a sermon series entitled "Give It Up" looking more deeply at what God asks us to give up in our lives and what does He has to offer us that far exceeds what He asks of us in our letting go. Many of us give up certain things for the forty days of Lent, and doing so can be a very beneficial thing for us. This seven-week series takes that idea one step further and as we talk each week about things that God wants us to give up, not just for forty days, but forever. Some of the topics we plan to cover include giving up: control, pride, success (status), enemies, false security, popularity (fitting-in), and ultimately our lives.

On Wednesday evenings in Lent, join us for Soup Supper and a fellowship series centered on the *Words of Life From The Cross* - the seven words of Christ that He spoke from the cross as He offered up His life for the lives of this world. Each word imparts a blessing and is a word of His Gospel. Together, we will expound on these words of Christ, linking them to Jesus' words and His works recorded in the Gospel as well as the Old Testament prophesies that pointed to Him. Each word of Christ proclaims and delivers something about Him, the Word Incarnate, and delivers His saving death to us such that we would trust Him for forgiveness, life, and salvation.

The penitential season of Lent is also a season for teaching and reaching the next generation. Our Lenten focus on the cross and Passion of the Lord Jesus Christ is intended to be a direct proclamation and confession of His Word and His grace. Our worship and teaching will focus on how Law and Gospel come together to deliver a heart of repentance guiding us to the forgiveness of our sins. Our exploration of God's Word will bring us as sinners to the cross of Christ as the fountain and source of forgiveness, life, and salvation.




