

Pastor's Pen

"Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here; he has risen! Remember how he told you while he was still with you in Galilee: 'The Son of Man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men, be crucified, and on the third day be raised again.'" Then they remembered his words." Luke 24:5-8

As this newsletter is being written and sent, we find ourselves in the middle of Holy Week, a time when we remember and relive the final steps Jesus walked as he made his way to the cross. The events of that last week of our Lord's life changed our world forever. Nothing in our world is the same as a result of Good Friday and Easter. Everything in our lives is different and new as a result of Jesus' death on the cross and his resurrection from the dead.

It has always fascinated me that the question asked of those women who were the first to come to the tomb of Jesus on Easter morning, hoping to anoint his body for burial, is one that is still relevant for our world today. "Why do you look for the living among the dead?" "Why do you hope to find answers to life's questions in places they will never be found?" The Good Friday truth is that there is no hope apart from Jesus. The Easter truth is that there are no lasting answers outside of him.

This month, we have a number of opportunities to be "looking for Jesus" in places where he promises to be found **In our worship**, for the next several weeks, we will be reading passages that will serve to link our Lord's appearances to his disciples for the forty days he was with them following his resurrection, with his daily appearances to us 2000 years after the fact. In very real ways, our Lord is just as much living and active today as he was during those days following that first Easter. Our sermons will help us to look for Jesus in the right places.

In our adult Middle Hour, we will be adding a Bible study of the book of Revelation. For seven weeks, leading up to the Day of Pentecost, we will be digging into a book that is filled with hope, not only for those for whom it was first written back then, but for us who are here today. This new Sunday morning offering, along with our ongoing "Believe" study, will keep us looking for Jesus in places where he promises to be.

We will also, this month, be actively engaged, as a congregation, in support of the women of Village House. In serving the 12-15 homeless women who will be with us on our campus each night, we will be witnessing to our faith and providing tangible evidence that Christ is still alive and actively working through his Church. This serving and witnessing opportunity will help to keep us and the women we serve looking for hope and promise where it can be found.

As followers of Jesus, it is essential that we stop looking for the living among the dead. It is crucial that we continue looking for answers in life in places where God promises to answer. It is also imperative to our calling that we use every opportunity we have to witness to our Good Friday and Easter hope.

I look forward to worshiping and studying and witnessing and serving with you in life-changing ways. Jesus is alive. He is still among us. Let's work together to help each other and others look to him.

Since our arrival here we have been busy adjusting and also teaching at the seminary and supervising construction work and hosting friends and visitors from the US etc. It is exciting to meet with the new students who joined the seminary after we left for our home assignment in 2016.



The building above is staff quarters for seminary teachers and community health workers. Due to various challenges it looked like that the building wouldn't be ready for dedication on Dec. 31, 2017 but by

God's grace and extraordinary work by the builders, the work was completed. There are six units in this building; three units are for the teaching faculty of the seminary and three units are for the workers of community health ministry. It was special for us to host 11 guests from US during dedication ceremony.

We have shared with you about a very exciting ministry of a Christian Boarding School (K-12). Below is the proposed



site for the Christian Boarding School. The picture was taken from the roof of the seminary. The vision of the school is "Raising Next Generation for God's Mission."

We have been studying the *Fruits of the Spirit* with our kids on Sunday mornings. See if you can memorize these verses with your family this month!


