

Pastor's Pen

"Although I am less than the least of all God's people, this grace was given me: to preach to the Gentiles the unsearchable riches of Christ, and to make plain to everyone the administration of this mystery, which for ages past was kept in God, who created all things. His intent was that now, through the church, the manifold wisdom of God should be made known to the rulers and authorities in the heavenly realms, according to his eternal purpose which he accomplished in Christ Jesus our Lord." Ephesians 3:8-11 NIV

In writing to the believers in Ephesus, the apostle Paul lifts up a number of truths inherent to his ministry. He admits that he is unworthy of his calling, describing himself as *"the least of all God's people."* He accepts that his calling to preach the word of God is only by *"the grace of God."* He acknowledges that the means God has chosen to proclaim his word is through people, *"through the Church."* And he affirms the fact that God's *"eternal purpose"* in saving the world has now been *"accomplished in Christ Jesus our Lord."*

During the week of August 13-17, Pastor Brian and I, along with representatives from the more than 420 congregations in the North American Lutheran Church, will be gathering in Denver, Colorado for our annual Convocation. The week will include opportunities for the delegates to share in worship, be encouraged by what God is doing throughout the NALC, and to be challenged with what it means to be a church body committed to making disciples of Jesus Christ. Reports will be shared, budgets will be passed, elections will take place, and many debates and discussions and decisions will happen and be made. In the midst of it all, some of the *least of God's people*, called by *his grace*, gathered as *the Church*, will share in furthering *God's eternal purposes* accomplished in Christ Jesus.

When the North American Lutheran Church was formed, it committed itself to four Core Values that continue to be foundational to everything it is about. As you read these brief descriptions, know that they also describe things of value to us.

In writing to the believers in Ephesus, the apostle Paul lifts up a number of truths inherent to his ministry. He admits that he is unworthy of his calling, describing himself as *"the least of all God's people."* He accepts that his calling to preach the

I ask for your prayers for Bishop John Bradosky and his staff, for the delegates who will be gathering in Denver, and for decisions and directions that will bring honor to our Lord Jesus.

I am honored to belong to such a faithful and faith-filled church body, and to share in the work of the Gospel with you.

How does your garden grow?

"Listen! A farmer went out to sow his seed. As he was scattering the seed, some fell along the path, and the birds came and ate it up. Some fell on rocky places, where it did not have much soil. It sprang up quickly, because the soil was shallow. But when the sun came up, the plants were scorched, and they withered because they had no root. Other seed fell among thorns, which grew up and choked the plants, so that they did not bear grain. Still other seed fell on good soil. It came up, grew and produced a crop, some multiplying thirty, some sixty, some a hundred times." Mark 4:3-8 NIV

In order to have a beautiful garden there are some basic foundational elements needed to produce such beauty. Good soil, seeds, watering and pruning are necessary to grow your garden. Trying to grow your garden in poor soil or without watering will surely impact your garden. Faith is a lot like gardening in that, if we don't have proper soil and we don't continue to water and prune, we will become complacent or stagnant in our faith.

We all have different ways in which we water or prune our relationship with Christ. Part of being a disciple is sharing our faith with others to help plant their seeds or to help water their soil. Sharing our faith not only strengthens our relationship with Christ, but it also helps others grow in faith. Sharing our faith can be done verbally as well as outwardly displayed in our actions or in our demeanor. We have the opportunity to share our faith in every aspect of our lives such as work, school, the gym, or even the grocery store.

Sharing our faith within our own church can also help others who don't feel as though their faith is quite as strong as they would like it to be. One great way to help others learn and grow in faith is by sharing faith testimonials. Testimonials can be very relatable, encouraging, hopeful and inspiring. Even though the soil is good and the seeds are planted, we may be falling short in the watering or pruning department. As part of a council sub-team initiative to disciple to our non-church community, we are looking for people who would be willing to share their testimony and how they live out their faith on a daily basis. Fall 2018 Middle Hour Bible Fellowship

Our Fall 2018 Middle Hour Bible Fellowship will include the following three offerings:

- "Jesus and Women" (Pastor Jonna) 12-weeks beginning September 16th In this middle hour class, we will take a look at women in the Bible through the eyes of Jesus. Men and women are invited to join us, as we explore Jesus and women in the Gospels and consider what this might mean for us today. Bring your favorite Bible, pen, and notebook. All are welcome!
- "Romans: From Belief to Behavior" (Pastor Dan / Pastor Brian) 12-weeks beginning September 16th In this middle hour Bible study, we will explore the righteousness of God and how His Word, through Paul's epistle to the Christians in Rome, guides us through what to believe and how to behave when it comes to sin, salvation, spiritual formation, sovereignty, and responsibility.

We will explore the basic promises of salvation, prayer, victory, forgiveness and guidance and then better understand how to live out our faith in the world enlightened by putting Christ first, equipped by the church, and empowered by His Word and Spirit.

St. Timothy's Legacy Fund



This spring, the Leadership Team offered a scholarship from the Legacy Fund to support a graduating high school senior who will be attending a 4-year school in the fall. The Legacy Fund is separate from the church budget and was set up to support mission and ministry projects important to St. Timothy's vision. Money for the fund comes from donations from the congregation. These donations are

then invested, and it is the income earned from the investments that is used to provide financial support for the mission needs. This is our second year to provide a scholarship to support a graduating high school senior. After the scholarship was announced, a congregation member offered to provide additional funds to increase the amount of money available. As a result, we were able to provide a \$1000 scholarship to our recipient.

This year's recipient is Amanda McCarthy, a long time member of St. Timothy's, who has been involved in a number of ways – VBS, Sunday worship, the Mercy Mobile – all while pursuing her passion for dance. Her faith was instilled at an early age and has continued to be an important part of her life as she moved through high school. Amanda will be going to UC Irvine in the fall to study dance.

As part of the application process, the applicants had to write a short essay about how St. Timothy's helped shape their faith. The following is an excerpt from Amanda's essay:

"For the majority of my life I have been a dancer and am still continuing this passion of mine. Every time I perform, it has become a ritual for me to pray before. The prayer before I perform lets me know that He is there with me on stage helping me fight through any pain or problems I have. I gather myself or my team to come together in prayer because with Him all things are possible."

Congratulations to Amanda! You are an inspiration to us all. We pray that you continue to grow and share your faith as you move on to the next stage in life.

Musicians Matters

In his book "The Blue Zones," Dan Buettner studied the habits, diet and lifestyle of centenarians clustered in communities throughout the world. He summarizes the lessons learned from the people who have lived the longest. Lesson 7 is "healthy centenarians everywhere have faith." He writes,
