

I will begin with something that may sound odd. I have been thinking about prayer a lot lately. Perhaps you are thinking, "Well, don't you always think about prayer? You are a pastor, after all." The truth is, I don't always wonder about the various aspects of prayer. I have been a lot more lately, though.

In our church family, we have had a lot to pray for. It has seemed that the moment we begin praying for someone (particularly for healing), there is immediately another person who is in desperate need of healing. So many prayer requests, and so many prayer requests which have lasted for quite some time.

We know that God is a God of healing and that He loves us. We also know that God is not controlled by us; we cannot manipulate God into doing our will.

It seems that often, we either pray distrusting that God desires to hear our prayers, or we pray to overcome God's reluctance. In the second case, we try to convince God of something we believe He ought to do. But, as Martin Luther once wrote, "Prayer is not overcoming God's reluctance. It is laying hold of His willingness."

I have been thinking about this quote a lot lately. I've also been thinking a lot about a story in Mark 9. A man brings his son to Jesus. His son has a spirit that has put him into convulsions. He says, "'If you can do anything, take pity on us and help us." Jesus responds, "'If you can? Everything is possible for one who believes." The man exclaims, "I do believe; help me overcome my unbelief!" (Mark 9:22 – 24).

The man's response to Jesus has become my prayer. Lord, I believe; help me overcome my unbelief!

When I was in college, I met a woman named Sophi. Sophi had moved with her husband and four children to Lithuania, so that her husband could teach Sociology at Lithuania Christian College. They were in their second and final semester in Lithuania when I met them while studying abroad. Sophi's kindness, candor, and faith inspired me. She was a person I wanted to become like. She and her family would be returning to the Los Angeles area, where her husband was a Sociology professor at Azusa Pacific University – the same university I attended!

Before that semester ended, I asked Sophi if she would be my mentor when we returned to the States. She agreed, with the caveat that we meet Friday mornings at the school track at 7am for prayer. Her plan sounded demanding, but a plan I could do!

I was thinking about Sophi and our prayer walks last week, as I prepared to meet with a group of ladies for prayer at 7am Monday morning. Our prayer group has now met twice, and I would like to take this opportunity to make a public invitation to the congregation and surrounding community to join us. We meet Monday mornings in the Sanctuary at 7am. If you would like to stop by to pray on your way to work, school, or would simply like the encouragement of others in prayer, please join us. You're welcome to pop in just once or join us every week. We pray together for those needs within our hearts for local needs, community needs, and needs in the world. We pray over every prayer request on our weekly prayer list. We encourage one another with the honesty that we are all still growing and that there are many places in our lives in which we desire God to help our unbelief.

Please know that you are welcome to join us and that you are being prayed for.

#### **LIBRARY NEWS**

Are you aware that we, St. Timothy's Church, has a library! While it is small, this library, it has over 1,300 adult books (once all are returned). The library also has a children's section. Videos/DVDs are available for children and adults. The library is open on Sundays and access is available at other times when the library is not in use.

Our Church Library is basically a self-help library. **Self-help** means one can select a book or books, sign the enclosed book or DVD **card** and leave the card in the **library** deposit box. **Directions for checking out books are posted on a bulletin board.** 

If one feels the library should have a particular book available, they can make a request to Carolee Crane, the Church Librarian. This can be done by leaving a note in the book return box, calling or emailing me. Her email and phone number is listed in the Church Membership Directory or in St. Tim's Connect.

There is no set time for the return of a book or DVDs, however, it is recommended books or DVDs be returned within 6 to 8 weeks. This allows others the opportunity to read or share the book or DVD.

## A Report from Our Mission Partners in India

Neeral and Nijhar are in MN to take care of some of the needs of their children. They took this opportunity to share about different ministries that we are part of in Ranchi, Jharkhand, India. More than anything, the report is to celebrate God's faithfulness and our partnership in God's mission.

After more than 15 years of serving in Ranchi, when we look back we see God's foot prints all over. And we are most thankful. One of the many things that gives us joy and satisfaction is the young and capable leaders that we have had the privilege of mentoring and encouraging. Thus, the various ministries are being led by these friends and we are confident that the Lord would use them to accomplish his purposes in and through these ministries.

#### Navin Doman Theological College (NDTC)

The College has 40 students now. 9 students are on internship in different communities. There are six full time and four part time faculty in the seminary. The seminary has produced 40 ordained pastors and more than 70 evangelists and missionaries who are serving in many communities in twelve different states of India. A highlight of the year was the completion of faculty and community health ministry housing.

The after-school program continues to draw children from nearby communities. The seminary students get hands on training to teach and mentor these mostly non-Christian children. The children get help for their school work and also learn about basic hygiene. These very poor children are affirmed and get encouragement as seminary students share the love of Jesus with them.

#### Skill Development Ministry

74 young men and women were trained in six different trades -- carpentry, welding, computer repair, electrician, motorcycle repair and tailoring. They were given basic tools in their respective trades. After training and internship many of these trained workers have started their own business. The seminary provides them support so that they can share the Gospel through their business. As part of their commitment, the trainees have pledged that after few years they would train the next group of trainees.

#### **Community Health Ministry**

Two trained workers, including one of our graduates, are serving the nearby communities in the area of alcoholism and malaria. Two volunteer medical doctors are available alternatively on Saturdays in the seminary campus for free consultation. The vision of the project is to involve students of the seminary for hands on training for counseling and management and also to equip congregations in different areas to reach out to communities around them in Jesus' name for mental, physical and spiritual well-being.

#### Persecution in the Area

The state government in Jharkhand state (Ranchi is the capital) has been passing laws to harass and persecute Christians. Last year the state government passed anti-conversion bill in the state legislative assembly to target Christians and Christian work. In recent months, it has reached alarming levels as Christian organizations are banned and Christians have been jailed for no reason. You can read more about this if you Google "persecution in Jharkhand" or some such similar search.

#### Preparation for the Boarding School

We have been preparing for this school by consulting with the lawyers and visiting a few schools to understand the process, requirements for the establishment of a Christian boarding school. There is still some issue with forest department that has claimed part of the land during our absence. In a very hostile environment, we want to move carefully so that we fulfill all the requirements laid down by the government and avoid any undue attention of the government officials who are against Christian activity. According to the lawyer we should wait for the general election next year before launching this school.

We thank you for your prayers and support for us and for God's work in the Ranchi area. We count it our privilege to pray for you. May we request you to kindly continue to pray for all these ministries, the Church and Christian people in that area especially this difficult time.

May the Lord bless you and the ministry that you are part of.
