

PASTOR'S PEN

Dear Friends at St. Timothy's,

I must admit that this is *not* my favorite season — the season of Lent, I mean. Every year, I get so excited for Advent and Christmas. The colors are bright, the songs are cheery, and people are generally in a good mood and ready for a party. As Christians, this excitement is multiplied, because we have something really wonderful to look forward to right around the corner. The waiting doesn't take long either — a mere four weeks, and then the celebration of Christmas!

Lent is completely different. It is not far from twice the wait, and it is so drab! Dark colors of purple and black in the church, depressing songs, irritable moods, and no parties. Some choose to fast, and are constantly disappointed that they are not more disciplined and then confess every time they cheat and eat another bite of chocolate. Their friends wonder why they even bother. The outside world has gone back to its regular routines of work and no play. It's no wonder Lent is not my favorite season!

Naturally, I don't like when people tell me how to feel or what to do. I don't like when people tell me I ought to be happy or I ought to be sad, I ought to be thankful or I ought to move on. When I was growing up, I was frequently annoyed when people would tell me not to wear shorts or to dry my hair when it was cold outside. I wanted to decide for *myself* how I would feel and whether or not I wanted to risk illness.

It is my natural tendency to want to feel and do as I please, as I am sure is true for you. As I have gotten older, however, I have come to appreciate the outcomes of discipline, the counsel of wise friends and family, and *seasons*.

Seasons indicate to us that it is not always time for joy, just as it is not always time for sorrow. It is natural and *healthy* to experience both in their proper time, and perhaps we *need* imposed seasons of darkness in particular. We need to be reminded that we all experience great hurt and are wounded. We need to be reminded that we are sinners who desperately need to be forgiven. We need to be reminded that we cannot save ourselves and we will never be perfect. We need to be reminded that we all will one day die; no one can avoid this reality. We all need to be reminded to repent, to turn back to our original starting place, at home with God our Father.

This Lent, I encourage you to join us Wednesday nights beginning March 6th, for a season of repentance, a season of turning to the Father, who is already running after you with outstretched arms. Dinner (soup supper), will begin at 6:15pm, and a short service will begin at 7pm. Our series will be based on Rembrandt's painting of *The Return of the Prodigal Son*, and Henri Nouwen's book with the same title. Together, we enter into a season of repentance, turning from where we have been, to where our heavenly Father is.

Village House – Interfaith Shelter of Hope returns to St. Timothy's on April 3rd and will run through May 6th.

For those still unfamiliar with Village House, Village House is a network of churches providing year-round monthly rotating shelter for up to 15 medically and emotionally fragile homeless women while they work with a designated case worker on programs designed to provide stability for their lives.

Volunteers engage these wonderful ladies and each other to create

a truly blessed opportunity to share Christ's love with others in our community. Volunteer positions range from providing meals and laundry service to transportation, greeting the guests at intake, providing overnight supervision and discharging them in the morning. Volunteer spots will be available for the overnight shelter at St. Timothy's as well as a day shelter at San Jose Christian Reformed Church (the church next to St. Timothy's).

Volunteers sign up through a web app called signup.com. To volunteer, simply go to www.stlcsjvillagehouse.org and follow the prompts to sign up. There will also be a link to our Village House website on the St. Timothy's Lutheran Church website. We will also be manning sign up tables after each service through the second week in April for additional assistance. Please note that most volunteer spots require volunteer screening through Protect My Ministry. Information and instructions for screening will be available on the sign-up.com site.

Volunteer training is tentatively scheduled for Thursday, March 28th at 7:00 PM in the Carter Great Room and Sunday, March 31st at 12:30 PM in the Fellowship Hall. Hope to see you there.

Excerpts from a letter from Neeraj and Nijhar (Word Mission Prayer League Missionaries):

In this letter we would like to share about our family situation. In September last year, we had to come back to the US to take care of our children Maani (18) and Urbas (16). We had left them here to continue their study, but it did not work out for them to stay with a friend the way we had thought. After much prayer and sharing with others, we sense God is calling us as parents to provide and care for our children. Though we feel torn between our calling as parents and as missionaries in India, the Lord has given us peace and a new way to be part of India Mission in Minneapolis serving the cause of our Lord Jesus Christ in the US and also in India. Thus, our area of responsibility is India Mission and Global Mission Educator in the US.

Kindly uphold us in your prayers as this transition was not planned. As our mission partners we seek your advice and insights as to how we can honor your partnership for God's mission in India and provide for our children in US. We value your partnership with us and would do everything in our capacity to achieve the mission vision for which you have trusted us. We deeply honor your trust in us. The following will give you an idea of the state of the India mission

- 1. The seminary will continue to function well as there is a good group of teachers and the Church Synod solidly behind it. We are exploring possibilities to organize classes/seminars via internet.
- 2. The Lord is providing a key group of people to work for the establishment of the boarding school and community health ministry. In light of the political situation of the region, the lawyer that we are working with for boarding school has advised us to move cautiously for boarding school and wait for the general election this year which might bring about a change in political regime.
- 3. We hope to travel to India regularly to be part of what the Lord has called us to do there in India.

While in US, as your missionaries we would be available for preaching, speaking and other ways you see fit for our involvement in your ministry for the sake of God's glory and His glorious kingdom. Also, we would look forward to welcoming you and arranging visits of church groups to Ranchi, India so that this partnership is strengthened and India mission remains a blessing for both sides.

We assure you of our prayers as we continue to depend on the Lord who declares- "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways," declares the Lord. "As the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts." (Isaiah 55:8-9)

Impact Report prepared for: 2018 Silicon Valley Discipleship Walk

YOU MADE AN IMPACT IN PERU! WALK FOR WATER

This year, the Silicon Valley Discipleship Walk for Water brought together over 130 people to fight the global water crisis. Together, your efforts raised over \$72,000 to help support safe water projects currently underway surrounding the Peruvian Amazon. Below are a few of these projects.

GABRIELA NUNEZ PROJECT

The community of Gabriela Nunez in Peru is home to over 250 people, who were in desperate need of a safe water solution in their village. The existing borehole was pulling sand into the water. Because of your funds, Water Mission was able to drill a deeper borehole and provide a better pump, treat the existing water source and provide a safe and sustainable water source for generations to come.

DARWIN GRANDEZ PROJECT

After assessment, Water Mission implemented a safe water system in the community of Darwin Grandez, comprised of over 2,100 people. After installing a new pump and water treatment equipment, they recruited a volunteer safe water committee, and trained them on health and hygiene education.

IMPACT OF YOUR SUPPORT

Water Mission simply could not do what we are called to do without you. The awareness and funds you helped raise are long-term sustainability for communities that no longer have to fetch unsafe water from distant sources or wait in queues for an insufficient amount. These people will have their thirst quenched by the safe water, but also the Living Water of Jesus Christ.

Jose Grandez says, "Health is definitely improved. There are not so many cases of dengue and malaria; nor do we suffer constantly from vomiting or diarrhea."

Thanks to the Silicon Valley Discipleship Walk for Water, Jose and so many others have a new future, and for that we are thankful!







Outreach into our community thru Alpha



On January 31 and February 1st, Pastor Jonna, Jenny Dittmer, Barton Quayle, and BJ Bushur attended the national Alpha Conference in Mesa, Arizona. We were looking to learn more about

how Alpha is working in congregations around the country to bring people to Jesus.

One of the key takeaways was the overview from David Kinnaman from Barna Group whose organization recently surveyed over 1 million people over the last 18 months and shared the findings in their "Reviving Evangelism" study. They cited that 47% of practicing Christian millennials say it's "wrong" to evangelize. Yet, 94% say "the best thing that could ever happen to someone is to come to know Jesus." Obviously, there is a misunderstanding of what it means to "evangelize." We have an opportunity to share the Good News about eternal life thru Jesus, and that the Christian faith is not only true, but good.

They also shared in their survey: "What are the qualities of a good person to talk with about faith?:"


Someone who:

Listens without judgment
Does not force a conclusion
Demonstrates interest in others
Exhibits a vibrant faith of their own
Is confident to express his/her own faith.

We think we can all learn from these current findings both what is true now in 2019, and what has been true throughout the centuries.
