

Pastor's Pen

"I thank my God every time I remember you. In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy because of our partnership in the gospel from the first day until now, being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus." Philippians 1:3-6

At the NALC National Convocation held in Indianapolis, Indiana, on August 7-9, the more than 600 delegates from around the country voted to elect me to a four-year term as the next Bishop for the North American Lutheran Church. It was an overwhelming week, to say the least. It was a life-changing week, at least in terms of what that decision means for Mary and me over the next few years. It was also a significant week for St. Timothy's, insofar as my calling as Lead Pastor for this congregation will soon come to an end and the transition into the new calling I have received will soon begin.

As the reality of the election has settled in and as I have had a chance to reflect on the implication of what it means, my mind is filled with thoughts, memories and reflections on what has been a wonderful and blessed nearly 25 years for me and my family. We began our ministry here in December 1994. My first service as pastor was on Christmas Eve. It was a wonderful opportunity to meet my new congregation and for the congregation to meet their new pastor. It was the beginning of a partnership that has continued from that day until my final day, now set for Sunday, September 8, 2019.

Since our ministry began here at St. Timothy's, all kinds of changes have taken place, including within me. I am a different person than I was back then. This is a different place than when I first started. Through it all, friendships have developed, partnerships have grown, and God has worked through us to build his Church.

I need you to know that I now truly feel called to serve as Bishop for the NALC. As a result of that calling, my calling

with you will soon change. But even as the calling changes and our lives will take new and differing paths, my love for you and for this place and for the calling we share in Christ has only been strengthened and grown.

In the big picture of what God is doing in this world, the changes we will soon be experiencing are only a small grain of sand on the vast shore of his saving work. And yet, the calling we have been given is not to save the world, but to pass on the name of the One who already has. Our shared calling is nothing more nor less than speaking the name of Jesus and sharing the good news of what God has done for us in him, one conversation at a time, one day at a time, with one person at a time.

It has been my privilege for the past 25 years to pastor in a place where God has been faithful, where relationships have grown, lives have been changed, and where eternity is being lived out, even now, as we place our faith and our trust in the One who is eternal. I have been blessed by these years. I have been blessed by you.

Over the next couple of weeks, my formalized ministry at St. Timothy's will come to a close. I will move on to a new calling. You will move on in new ways. In all of it, God will remain faithful and he will lead and guide and build his Church. Nonetheless, even as we move on, sharing in the work entrusted to us in Jesus, my love for you will remain.

From the bottom of my heart, thank you for the love and support and encouragement and patience you have afforded me during these years. Together, God has used us and this place to grow his kingdom, and together, our lives will always and forever remain connected in Christ.

I thank God for our partnership. I am confident in his promises. I look forward to seeing how he will continue to use you and me and us until the day of Christ Jesus.


Fall 2019 Middle Hour – NEW LOCATIONS!

St. Timothy's Legacy Fund Scholarship

This spring, the Leadership Team offered a scholarship from the Legacy Fund to support a graduating high school senior who will be attending school in the fall. Money for the fund comes from donations from the congregation. These donations are then invested, and it is the income earned from the investments that is used to provide financial support for the mission needs. After the scholarship was announced, a congregation member offered to provide additional funds to increase the amount of money available. As a result, we were able to provide four scholarships, instead of just one.

This year's recipients are Emma McCarthy, Anthony Matter, Alyssa Long, and Katy vanMaanen. All four are involved in St. Timothy's in a number of ways – VBS, Sunday School, and the Mexico Mission Trip, among other ministries. As part of the application process, the applicants were asked to write a short essay about how St. Timothy's helped shape their faith. The following are excerpts from these essays:

"VBS taught me how to teach the word of God to those younger than me, to motivate even reluctant learners and, by the end of a week, encourage them to continue to grow in their own faith. It is always important to learn from those around you, but it is even more impactful seeing the Bible from the children's perspective because I can now view the Word from these two different lenses and analyze and understand the stories with different things in mind. This ability to see the Bible in a different light allows me to grow in my faith and can help me understand points where I may have been confused or concerned previously."

Emma McCarthy, studying English & Kinesiology at Univ. of Puget Sound

"When I can go to church and soak in the Lord's messages about love and peace, I wear those messages like armour until I can make the next session. Due to how God is preached and how loving the pastors are St. Timothy's, I've never once felt my faith in God ever fade..."

Anthony Matter, studying Computer Science at West Valley College

"St. Tim's taught me to take risks and that what's perfect to me is not always perfect to others. I was offered leadership opportunities. One of those opportunities was to teach a small classroom of preschoolers. Which aided me on my mission of self-discovery, to which I know that I want to teach kids. So in addition to being an English Major, I am going to pursue teaching credentials because I have found my passion."

"We can all see this great power of God's acting through our fellow Christians every day, if only we open our eyes. And St. Timothy's has helped me realize that and open my own eyes. I have come to this change in belief through observing other church members, through volunteering with them, and through learning from the messages that are embodied in each of their actions....These experiences, provided to me through participating in life at St. Timothy's Lutheran Church, are what have made me the disciple of Christ that I am today."


CONGRATULATIONS PASTOR DAN!




