Dear Friends,

I have this faint memory of my little brother wearing a plastic hard hat and overalls, swinging a plastic hammer, and singing, "Kids under construction. Maybe the paint is still wet. Kids under construction. The Lord might not be finished yet."

Our memories are wonderful and fascinating. What we *remember* from our pasts and what we *don't* remember is fascinating. *How* we remember is also fascinating. Many of us paint the past in broad strokes – in black and white, good and bad.

When my good friend, Sarah, died in May, memories flooded my mind. Memories came to me that had not crossed my mind since the original event took place. I remembered exploring the little country town with Sarah, getting a lay of the land to understand how better to do ministry in that context. I remembered how she and her new husband came 45 minutes early to my birthday party, rolled up their sleeves and sweated in their party clothes, as they helped me prepare for the guests who would arrive. I remembered their anger with my then boyfriend for not following through on his promise to throw me this birthday party. I remembered going to a youth convention in San Diego together, and eating our first farm-to-table burgers. They were delicious!

These memories shocked me, as I realized how well she had loved me and how little I had recognized it. I found a card I had saved from my bachelorette party from Sarah. She told me how great of a match Alek was for me and how she loved me to the moon and back. I looked back at old text messages and saw one that said, "I love you more than you know." I remembered her saying this to me often. I realized in that moment that it was true. I *was* loved more than I knew. Sarah had been an incredible support to me for many years. How had I not known how much she loved me?

The first few years Sarah and I knew one another, I experienced a lot of frustration and doubt. I felt unsure of my calling to youth ministry (and to ministry in general), and felt unsupported in my ministry. My boyfriend was a source of frustration and subsequent dating didn't help that. I experienced intense doubt whether or not God would provide a husband for me.

I realized that my frustration and doubt had clouded my ability to see the good that was happening. I had been so fixated on what I did not like in my life, that I did not recognize the gift Sarah had given me in her friendship.

I want to encourage you that as you look back on your life, recognize that there is always good amidst the bad. There are glimmers of hope, even amidst incredible darkness. God's presence and love are always there, even when you do not notice. He will be with us and His Spirit will guide us, no matter how the circumstances look. We have much to be thankful for.

As we look to the future and a new fall season, there is much to look forward to. God will be with us and His Spirit will lead us into new life.

Alpha Update

We wanted to share our excitement and thanks for what God is doing thru Alpha at St. Tim's. We are so encouraged by the first Alpha sessions with the guests who came with questions about Jesus and faith, and how we saw/heard the Holy Spirit working among everyone. The discussion and Alpha videos helped share the Good News and dispelled some of the incorrect assumptions the "seekers" have about Christianity and Jesus.

"Silicon Valley" and our local area was represented in the room: people of all races, ages, backgrounds, & socio-economic groups were there. This was one of our goals in the Jesus SENDS team: to reach non-Christians in our DIVERSE Santa-Clara County community. And, the guests who are there seem to be primarily from those who just found Alpha on the Web or were from City Team ministries. One single man in his 20's is there because he just lost his grandmother a few months ago, and his grandfather (who doesn't live in this area) told him when he was asking questions about faith and Christianity: "You should check out an Alpha group." So he did. And he's here now, and seems to be loving it. He didn't know anyone and just came. He doesn't live close by, and said "I don't mind driving down here....everyone's so friendly and I feel accepted here...and ok asking any questions." Praise God. Another man is a married, late-20's Asian, has a wife who's a believer, and has an 18month-old son. He is not a believer, but has his wife, and two friends who were all at our table last week supporting him, and allowing him to ask some tough questions about Jesus, the Bible, and who was saved before Jesus came? He was encouraged by the couple with great grandchildren who sat with us, who have been believers for their whole lives, and are going because they are trying it out to see how they can get their adult children and grandchildren to Alpha and their spouses who don't know Christ. What they shared about their faith walk really struck a chord with the non-believer at the table.

And, having the City Team men who are newer in the City Team program there has been such a blessing too....to hear their struggles, where they are now in their faith walk, and literally how Jesus has saved them and some in their family in the program.

All glory be to God. Thanks to the congregation for what you have done to get Alpha going again at St. Tim's!

Please keep praying for our guests, new guests, and all the volunteers helping out with Alpha at St. Tim's. Please pray that we listen to the Holy Spirit to find those in our diverse Santa Clara county community who don't know Jesus yet and share with them the Light of the World!


