

"Behold, the days are coming, says the LORD, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house

make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah, not like the covenant which I made with their fathers when I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt." (Jeremiah 31:31-32)

Not like that covenant, indeed. "New covenant" can also be translated "New Testament," and we know the hopeful direction in which that leads.

We've just come to the end of our sermon series on the prophet Jeremiah and a good end it was: the above text is among the greatest promises to be found in the Old Testament. In it, Jeremiah is standing on tiptoe, straining to peek just over the horizon of his understanding and vision to see what God promises in spite of the unfaithfulness of his people. That was a very fitting theme for our Reformation Sunday worship.

Now, in just another month, we will enter that church year season of expectation known as Advent. Between now and then, however, we're passing through a very busy month, beginning with **All Saints Sunday on November 3**. That's a day on which we remember those who have gone before us – parents, spouses, other family members, members of our congregation and other loved ones, as well as people like Paul, Augustine and Luther who serve as examples of Christian faith and discipleship. In our case, we're also looking to the future with a group of young people receiving their First Communion!

And there's much more. We'll be celebrating **Thank Offering Sunday on November 17**, an opportunity for us to express our gratefulness to God by bringing food (canned or packaged goods along with frozen poultry) to the worship service for sharing with our FISH Food Pantry and City Team. Then we have our **Fall Fellowship on that same day, 4:30-7:00 pm**,

when we pack shoe boxes for Operation Christmas Child, share a potluck and just enjoy being with one another.

Our giving of thanks continues with our Thanksgiving Eve Service on Wednesday evening, November 27, at 7:00 pm. That's a time when many are preparing for the feast which follows the next day, of course, but do take some time to pause, catch your breath, and center yourself in worship. Perhaps you have friends or neighbors who could use some Thanksgiving centering and whom you could invite.

November is also the month when, as we draw near the end of the year and start planning for the year ahead, we make our **Stewardship Commitments for 2020**. You will soon be receiving a packet of materials in the mail which is intended to help you make commitments in both worship attendance as well as financial support of the congregation. Both are important. When you come to worship, you both honor God with your presence and your singing as well as receive strength for the week ahead as you hear God's word and receive Holy Communion. And its our financial support which makes it possible to do what we do as a congregation. Your commitments may be brought forward on **November 17**, **24** and **December 1** ... or may be dropped off at the church office during the week.

So much for which to give thanks to God ... we really do need a full month to do so. And then there is the joy of seeing our friends each Sunday; remember what we've recently been suggesting: So many friends to greet ... be sure to greet one or two you don't know each week.

South Valley FISH Food Pantry

In 2019, we have served 1366 children, 1652 adults, and 706 seniors. This is double the number of people served last year! Our 62 volunteers have helped us serve a total of 278 families since we opened in 2016. We continue to work with Second Harvest to get fresh food and produce to distribute to our clients. We also have a Grocery Rescue program with Smart & Final that has provided a variety of meats and other items.

We want to thank the St. Timothy's church family, St. Timothy's Preschool families & volunteers who help change lives in our community by serving food and sharing the Good News of the Bread of Life, Jesus Christ, with our clients. We thank you for your food, monetary donations, & your time and talents. Please continue to pray that we reach those in our community who need food and to hear the Good News about Jesus.

Bags are now available on a table in the narthex with a list of the items we are collecting. Please consider taking a bag and filling it with a few items to share with those in need. Your non-perishable donations may be left anytime outside our food pantry in the bin or on Sundays in the red wagon located in the narthex.

This is an inductive-method, 5-week study. We will read the text and find the meaning from it, rather than start with scholarly insights and apply them to the text. Bring your Bibles as we explore some common issues and challenges in our own lives and discover Paul's secret to contentment.


