PASTOR'S PEN

Dear Friends,

This is likely not news to you, but we live in a *fascinating* place. A place of great wealth and great poverty. A place which is the home of half the world's tech billionaires and the home of an educational powerhouse . A place all the world comes *to* and a place which influences the *world*. A place of so much growth and change. A place where there is always something new and stability is hard to come by. A place that recognizes its relational poverty and is desperate for connection, for meaning. A place where Christianity is foreign and often carries with it not baggage, but *curiosity*.

When I first came to St. Timothy's and began to meet with people for pastoral counseling, a distinct image came to mind. I saw individuals frantically doggy-paddling just to stay above the crashing waves, *desperate* for a life preserver. I had never met with people who were more aware of their need. They knew that they didn't have that life preserver, and they sought the church for that help.

After a handful of months, this image began to fade. I would recall this image from time to time, but forgot the depth of conviction I felt, that this was the truth for this area.

Earlier this week, I met with someone who is not a Christian but has been drawn to Jesus for quite some time. She told me that she wishes she believed in Jesus, because that would be such a comfort to her. It would be such a comfort to know that she could pray to a *Person*, to have *Someone* to hear her prayers. She asked me questions about Jesus and shared with me stories of her life. It was so *exciting* for me to share about Jesus with someone who had *never* heard the story of Jesus' life. As I shared with her, the second verse of the old hymn "I Love to Tell the Story" came to mind. "I love to tell the story, how pleasant to repeat. What seems, each time I tell it, more wonderfully sweet! I love to tell the story, for some have never heard the message of salvation from God's own holy Word."

This person was *desperate* to hear about Jesus, and she is not alone. We live in a culture that is *desperate* for Jesus, and we have the great privilege to share and to invite them into a relationship with him. I ask that you would pray that God would give you eyes to see and ears to hear, so that you can have the mouth to speak of God's goodness in Jesus Christ.

If you sense that there is an open door, invite them to Alpha! The first night of Alpha was January 26th at 5pm, but it's not too late for new guests to come! Invite them just to pop in. If the door is not yet open for them to accept that kind of invitation, I invite you to share your life with them. They *want* to share their lives and to receive support as they swim through the waves, and they *want* to hear about hope. Ask them questions about their lives and wait for the open doors. Pray that the Spirit would guide you.

The Spirit is doing a new thing in San Jose and in our church community, and I look forward to seeing the unfolding of that with you!

StTim'sConnect

On St. Tim's Connect, you can print your own Financial Giving Statement <u>anytime</u> you want. Start by logging into St. Tim's Connect at sttims.ccbchurch.com

1. On the left of the screen, click on "Give."

2. On the next screen, click the "Giving Statement" link to the right of the screen.

3. A dialog box will open. Select the appropriate options for the statement:

TYPE

Family - Generates a combined statement for a married couple and separate statements given by children or other family members that have given during the date range.

Individual - Generates one statement for each person in the family that has given during the date range.

DATE RANGE

This will determine which transactions to include in the statement. If running a year-end statement, under "Quick Date Range" select "last year."

TAX DEDUCTIBLE

Choose which transactions to include based on their tax deductible status: tax deductible, non-deductible, or both.

PLEDGE INFORMATION

Includes a summary of all pledges set up for the individual or family during the date range of the giving statement.

SELECT"RUN REPORT"

You can then save it as a PDF or print it.

An Interfaith Shelter of Hope

April 3 - May 4

Village House – Interfaith Shelter of Hope is a network of faith organizations providing a year-round, rotating shelter for up to 15 fragile homeless ladies. Each partner church provides overnight or day shelter for one month before moving the guests on to the next shelter site. The goal of VH is to provide a caring and nurturing environment for our guests for up to six months while they work through individual programs designed to provide stable housing, medical and psychological care, employment and even reconciliation with family.

St. Timothy's has participated as an overnight shelter for the last three years, and the ladies of Village House will be coming back to St. Timothy's for the month of April from Friday, April 3rd through Monday, May 4th. In addition, San Jose Christian Reformed Church has once again agreed to host a day shelter in conjunction with our overnight shelter. Volunteer opportunities range from providing evening meals, greeting our guests at intake, providing transportation, and laundry, to performing morning discharge as well as daytime shifts at San Jose Christian Reformed next door.

Volunteering in Village House is an amazing way to demonstrate God's love and model the Christian life to our guests and other volunteers. This has also been a great way to get to know and enjoy fellowship with other members of our congregation and volunteers from other faith communities. Village House has made a tremendous impact in both the lives of the guests and the volunteers serving them.

Look for more information about Village House and potential leadership opportunities as well as volunteer sign-ups in the coming weeks.

Thank you all, and I look forward to, once again, joining you in living out our calling as disciples and making a tremendous impact in our local community.
