PASTOR'S PEN

"Surely he has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows; yet we esteemed him stricken, smitten by God, and afflicted. But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities; upon him was the chastisement that made us whole, and with his stripes we are healed. All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned everyone to his own way; and the LORD has laid on him the iniquity of us all" (Isaiah 53:4-6).

In the day of the prophet Isaiah, centuries before the coming of Jesus, there must have been a good deal of speculation and wonder concerning who "he" was. One through whose suffering the sin of others could be forgiven? Inconceivable at the time, but today we know.

Last Wednesday was Ash Wednesday, and we who bore the dark stain of the cross on our brows that evening now enter our annual Lenten journey toward Easter, following the path that Jesus walked. There are rest stops along the way; did you know that the 40 days of Lent do not include the Sundays? Sundays in Lent are considered "little Easters" on which we are reminded of the Great Hope that lies at the end of the Lenten trail.

This year, through March and into April, we are again meeting on Wednesday evenings for a soup supper at 6:15 pm followed by our midweek Lenten service at 7:00 pm. As we gather, our theme will be the "Questions Jesus Asked" such as "Who Do You Say That I Am?" and "Why Are You So Afraid?" And, while you are noting dates, you might want to look ahead and mark your calendar with the dates for the Maundy Thursday (April 9), Good Friday (April 10) and Easter Sunday (April 12) services. Each of these Lenten evenings provides an opportunity to reflect upon who and whose we are as well as to share food and fellowship with good friends and meet some *new* friends. And there will be more information regarding the events surrounding Easter in our next newsletter.

During Lent, our Sunday morning **Middle Hour classes** for children, young people and adults continue, of course. Starting this Sunday, we will have a **new adult class on C. S.** Lewis' book, *The Great Divorce*, led by Michael Stamos. (Some of you may remember seeing the marvelous stage version of that book by the Fellowship for the Performing Arts some years ago. They will be returning to the Bay Area with that production in June, and so this class will be a good preparation for that.) If you haven't already picked up a copy of the book, it is readily available on Amazon (paperback or Kindle). To prepare for Sunday, read the first two chapters (a total of only 10 pages or so).

Finally, as we continue through this interim period of seeking our next lead pastor, we as a congregation are not sitting still. New avenues of outreach and discipleship are being pursued and Directors are being sought for Children's Ministry and Music Ministry. Join in prayer with the members of the newly formed search team for the Director of Music Ministry: Bob Grandey, Scott McClung, Russ Dietz, Bill Mowson, and Rebecca Selbo. And of course, continue to pray for the Pastoral Call Team as they search for and contact potential candidates. You will find a report on their work elsewhere in this newsletter.
