# Call Team Update

### The Holy Spirit is working us hard!

To date, we have assessed some 35 candidates. At the moment, 4 candidates are on the "active" list. Two of these have participated in a second interview.

We are following this process:

An initial letter of introduction is sent or received.

- One team member is assigned to that candidate and conducts a 1-1 conversation. If this goes well, the candidate is invited to send a profile.
- The profile is read and discussed by the entire team, with a decision taken to either continue or not to pursue (and the appropriate letter is sent).
- If continued, we begin the interview process with the entire team. This can include 1 or more interviews. References are checked.
- When we are able to meet in person, we will invite that candidate to visit St. Timothy's for a personal interview and to meet with relevant staff.

Finally, the candidate will be presented to the congregation for a vote.

We are still receiving new candidates, but will soon wind up that segment of the process. In the meantime, we have met some sterling members of the clergy and are encouraged by the work that is being done in many of our churches.

Please continue to uphold your Call Team in your prayers. It means a lot to know that you are doing so.

### <u>View from the Pew: Solitude and Spiritual Reflection</u> by Bob Mitri



As we enter the fourth month of shelter in place, I am reminded of Mark 6:31 – 32.... "Then, because so many people were coming and going that they did not even have a chance to eat, he said to them, 'Come with me by yourselves to a quiet place and get some rest.' So they went away by themselves in a boat to a solitary place."

Jesus values solitude, including solitude among believers.

Over the past three months I've had a chance to reflect upon our family's faith journey and give thanks to God. We were, at one time, caught up in the distractions like so many others. Traffic, meetings, deadlines, stress, no time to think. Church attendance was far from regular. Growth was stagnant. I don't think we even realized it.

But God had a plan. Events and opportunities that might otherwise have seemed ordinary had extraordinary purpose.

Enrolling our boys at St. Timothy's Elementary School was one pivotal event in our faith walk. Our time at the school (about 12 years) turned out to be far more than an academic experience for the boys. It was the launching pad into a faith community, a family of believers who encouraged each other, challenged each other, supported each other. School board, Walk for Water, food drives, Mexico Mission. School became church. Church became life. God had a plan.

Today, we're a part of a Family Grow Group comprised of, not surprisingly, families we met years ago through the school. Right now, meetings are conducted via Zoom. We're leveraging technology to grow in the Word and fellowship with believers. Whether face-to-face (which we long to go back to) or on the family iPad, Grow Group has become an indispensable part of our walk with Jesus and with our brothers and sisters. If you're not a part of a Grow Group, prayerfully consider joining one.

These months of solitude have enabled all of us to reflect and perhaps recalibrate priorities. My prayer for everyone is that this time of Shelter in Place, as inconvenient as it may seem, has not only protected you physically, but given you the opportunity to grow closer to the Lord – with minimal distractions.

## Blessed to be a Blessing: What God has Made Possible through You By Pastor Jim

We have certainly been greatly blessed as a congregation during this most challenging time of Shelter in Place. I think first and foremost of people: Pastor Jonna, our Staff and Leadership, plus Russ Dietz and others who are making our Sunday morning worship services not merely possible but uplifting and inspiring.

If you were "in worship" on May 17, you will also have heard from our Leadership Council President, Ken Duvall, of another great blessing we have experienced as a congregation -- one which we have been able to "pass forward." At the end of last year, we discovered that we had a fairly large chunk of benevolence money still unspent from previous Capital Campaigns. Thus, in January and February our Leadership Council explored how we -- who have been blessed to be a blessing -- might best use the money.

We contacted two groups with which we have had a long and good relationship and track record: CityTeam, a local ministry to folks often coming off the streets, and World Mission Prayer League (WMPL), a Lutheran global missionary society. In each case, we found projects in need of funding.

With CityTeam, we were already going to fund part of their new computer Learning Center with our Capital Campaign funds. With these additional benevolence funds, we were able to fund the whole thing plus pay for construction of a room to house clothing for job interviews for CityTeam men and women -- all with our gift of \$27,000.

In the case of WMPL, we were able to provide \$50,000 of startup funds for the launching of a new much-needed Director of Global Operations position. David Grosz is now beginning his work in that position in the midst of some most challenging times. He writes, "We've been having online seminars to help our overseas staff be good stewards of this time. We are also receiving funding requests from our international partners for financial assistance in meeting the severe needs of the people they serve."

Again, we have, as a congregation, been greatly blessed by God during this time; and we recognize that there is a reason for this: we have been blessed in order to be a blessing. We thus want to share the joy of that with you.



Even in the midst of SIP, **St. Tim's Youth** still has tons going on! We are continuing to meet for CORNERSTONE over Zoom for both junior high and high school, are working through daily devotional plans (contact Joe or Anna-Marie if you would like to receive these and don't already), and have all sorts of other ways that we live out the truth that the church is about *the people*, not *the building*! We may not be meeting together in person, but the Holy Spirit is still present and at work in and through our faith family to do great things for Jesus! We continue to pray for you and can't wait for the time when we are able to meet again in person. Until then, see you on Zoom!
