I thank my God every time I remember you. Facility Repairs Update

Following the successful termite tenting of the campus in May, we have continued to make a number of repairs to our facilities. A number of buildings, including the sanctuary building, had suffered places where dry rot set in, particularly in the wall behind the altar and in the roof outside of the narthex.

The bulk of those repairs are now complete, and we are well under budget for all the repairs and painting. The next major step in our building maintenance is to our roofs, including repairing a number of tiles that had broken or fallen from the sanctuary, as well as a replacement of the roof on the FISH Food Pantry wing.

We would like to express our deep thanks to Chip Bronk and Don Hoque for their tireless coordination and leadership of all of this work.

Listening to Genesis

All too often, Genesis becomes a battleground. Some contend for six 24 hours days of creation and others see it merely as stories told by ancient Israelites sitting around their campfires. And that's just folks within the church! But what does Genesis itself want to say to us? More to the point, what is God saying to us in Genesis? Short answer: Genesis is concerned with a whole lot more than simply matters of creation.

St. Timothy's Legacy Fund Scholarship

The Legacy Fund was set up to support mission and ministry projects important to St. Timothy's vision, but separate from the regular church budget. Money for the fund comes from planned gifts from the congregation; these gifts may be directed either toward increasing the fund endowment or funding specific projects of interest to both the donor and St. Timothy's. The endowment portion of the Legacy Fund is invested, and the income earned from the investments provides financial support for such projects as this year's scholarship program. This year, Leadership Council approved awarding up to ten \$1000 scholarships to college-bound graduates from the congregations of the NALC's Central Pacific Mission District of which St. Timothy's is a part. We received eight applications and were able to award \$1000 scholarships to each of those applicants. This is up significantly from the four scholarships that we awarded in 2019.

All of the recipients are involved in St. Timothy's in a number of ways – FISH, Youth Group, Music Ministry, VBS, Sunday School, and the Mexico Mission Trip, among other ministries. As part of the application process, the applicants were asked to write a short essay about how St. Timothy's has helped shape their faith. The following are some excerpts from these essays:

- If there is one thing that quarantine has taught me, it's that a building doesn't make a church; the people do. I sit at home and watch church with my parents every week, and I feel God's love. (Katie Briner)

- My home church is a safe haven; it's the one place in the world that I will always feel welcome. It has opened my eyes and provided the opportunities I needed in order to become an active Christian, and the motivation to continue to build on my relationship with God. (Sara Stamos)
- This experience taught me how to love people no matter what and I believe that is what being a Christian is all about. I will share my faith with a new community in college by loving people well because that's what God calls us to do. (Victoria Thornton)


