Dear Friends at St. Timothy's,

Happy Advent! And welcome to my favorite time of the year! Perhaps like me, you are breathing a sigh of relief that we are actually and *finally* here! At times, this year has seemed so dark, that we have questioned whether or not we might *ever* get to Advent and Christmas! I can't *tell* you when I have been happier to usher in this season, this season of hopeful anticipation, breaking the icy gloom which threatens to swallow us whole.

We are in a new season, and that *doesn't* mean that we need to be happy all of the time like Elf (although that wouldn't be too shabby), but it *does* mean that our *focus* needs to shift. In Advent, you and I are called away *from* our preoccupations *to* the hope of Jesus.

We anticipate afresh the coming of Jesus in human flesh. This Advent season, we encourage you to invite your neighbors and join us in preparing your hearts with hope. Join us for Sunday morning worship, our Online Family Advent Series, and daily devotions.

And come back to celebrate Christmas! Our children and family event this year is Dough Holy Night: A Sweet Celebration of our Dear Savior's Birth (see the Children's Page for more details). Our Christmas Eve services are in the works! They will look different this year, but they will be no less special. Stay tuned for more details.

May the hope of Advent bring you to the joy of Christmas!

South Valley FISH Food Pantry Update

What a challenging, strange and emotional year this has been for everyone and we have seen this evidence in a significant increase in the number of FISH clients served during the pandemic. We couldn't have done this without the support, prayers and encouragement of so many people. We served 152 families at our Thanksgiving distributions and will be holding two Christmas distributions on December 10th and December 17th.

Meet the families:

Each of these three families are regular clients of South Valley FISH Food Pantry who are struggling, in their own way, to make ends meet in this valley. All of them expressed deep gratitude and relief when they were offered the opportunity to participate in this ministry. Thank you for making this ministry happen each year!

Family 1: This family is comprised of two parents, three sons and one grandma. The family has had a rough go since 2018 when the mom lost her job and insurance. However, even when they are down, they know God is good and feel blessed to have been chosen.

Family 2: This family of six moved into this area in March so their son could go to Oster Deaf School. Then the pandemic hit, which hit them hard as both parents work in the restaurant industry. The mom had to stop working and her husband's hours have been reduced. They are so thankful to God for giving them the opportunity to be adopted for Christmas.

Family 3: Like a lot of families, COVID has also hit this family of five hard. They are two parents, one grandma and two children that live together. The dad's work has been inconsistent this year due to COVID. Being chosen as an adopt-a-family has been such a blessing for them.

LCMC Partnership Opportunity

During the Call Process, it was brought to the Call Team's attention that there is a great opportunity for ministry and connection with other Lutheran churches through **LCMC**, **L**utheran **C**ongregations in **M**ission for **C**hrist. In fact, it was through LCMC that we discovered Pastor Jim Cords and were able to extend a call to him. On behalf of the Leadership Team, we are excited to bring to the congregation an opportunity to establish a partnership with LCMC.

What does this mean?

Partnering with LCMC will provide opportunities to expand our ministries and relationships within the broader Lutheran community. This will change nothing about our existing affiliation with, nor allegiance to, the NALC. Since LCMC is an association (not structured as a denomination), joining involves a vote by means deemed appropriate by each congregation and there is no required commitment regarding time, energy, or finances.

Why establish this partnership?

Many NALC and LCMC congregations are dual affiliated for the practical purpose of working together, sharing resources, and also clergy. We share the same theology (a common confession), and believe we will only benefit from more relationships with other Lutheran churches, especially those in our geographic region.

Although the Call Team was able to extend a call to Pastor Jim, partnering with the LCMC would make the pathway easier and more accessible to reach LCMC pastors if needed in the future.

Pastor Jim is currently the Chair of the Ministry Board for LCMC and by dual-affiliating with LCMC, this would allow him to continue with his remaining two-year term in this position. Pastor Jim will be able to continue these important relationships, expanding ministry opportunities, resources, and influences for the work we are doing within the NALC and beyond.

What are the next steps?

We want to make sure you, the congregation, are aware of and supportive of this partnership as we move forward. We will invite the congregation into the conversation by offering an informational meeting with a Q&A to respond to any questions or concerns. We plan to bring this to a congregational vote at our annual meeting in January. Look for more details to come.

Wishing you a blessed Advent as we look to the birth of our Savior, our Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, and Prince of Peace.

Improve your Sundays -- and your Christmas!

If you are attending online worship on Sundays using your computer, and are just using its screen and sound, here is an idea that will greatly improve your worship experience. And, with **Christmas** coming, it will make that celebration all that more festive.

All you need to do is connect your computer to your television using an HDMI cable (easily purchased on <u>Amazon</u>). All recent (the past 10 years or so) flat screen TVs and computers should come with HDMI ports (plugs in the side, front or back).

You are probably familiar with USB ports; HDMI ports look similar except they are not a perfect rectangle but have their corners clipped a bit.

Here are the **four short steps** to getting connected:

1. Be sure your computer (laptops probably work the easiest) and TV have HDMI ports and then **<u>buy the cable</u>** (see Amazon link above). A 10 ft cable makes it easier to place a laptop near where you sit, but any length will do.

2. <u>Connect the cable</u> to the HDMI ports in the computer and the TV. TVs usually have several HDMI ports, so note whether it is HDMI1, HDMI2, HDMI3, etc.

3. Look for "Source" on your TV remote and switch the TV to the proper HDMI source (HDMI1, HDMI2, HDMI3, etc.).

4. <u>Turn on the computer</u> and go to worship! The image on the computer screen should immediately also appear on your TV and you should also hear the sound now coming from your TV sound system.

That's all there is to it.


