## Pastor's Pen

Dear Friends,

A handful of years back, my dad pastored a church which caused him a lot of anguish. Some of the stories he told me were *shocking*. As I heard these stories, I felt protective and wanted to give the troublemakers a piece of my mind! What right did they have to cause my dad such grief?! After a short while, I came to the conclusion that my dad must *not* have heard the calling of God correctly, because if he had, he wouldn't have pastored that troublesome church.

As I've gotten older (and watched my crow's feet settle in!), I have re-evaluated my conclusion. Naturally, I don't *want* to believe that God would call us to a place or a people that is painful or difficult; I *want* God's calling to be filled with affirmation and joy! But Scripture gives us a plethora of examples which indicate that the way *isn't* always enjoyable. Jesus in fact tells his disciples that whoever comes after him must take up their *cross* and follow him (Matthew 16:24). He tells his disciples to *expect* hardship. Experiencing hardship, however, is not *confirmation* of following in the way of Jesus, but it is a part of the journey.

Now, I want to *assure* you that I am not writing this because there are a lot of "alligators in the water" at St. Tim's! One of the reasons I was *attracted* to St. Timothy's in my call process was because of the *health* of the congregation. We are not perfect by any means; we are all sinful and have lots of room for growth, but we *are* a healthy congregation. And that's attractive!

We are in a season of continued transition, and that is never easy, but I am compelled to encourage you to hang in there!

As I was reminded at Alek's ordination, a church needs her leaders, but she is a church and called to follow Jesus, *regardless* of who her leaders are. As we continue to come out of hibernation, we are reminded that Pastor (now Bishop) Dan is no longer the lead pastor. And we are forming new relationships with Pastor Jim. We are living into this new reality that Joe Hill has transitioned away from his long-standing ministry at St. Tim's. We affirm Anna-Marie's lead of middle school and high school ministry this summer, and await the long-term fulfillment of the roles which Joe held. We wish we could keep her on our church staff, but we affirm Emily Hindenes' calling back into the classroom. And we pray for whoever God will bring to be our next Director of Children and Family Ministry.

So that everyone is in the loop, here is a quick note on our process for our children and family ministry coverage:

1. Tony and Leslie Mazzucco will take point to organize and ready St. Tim's Kids for the fall.
2. I am pulling together a hiring team to seek out our next Director of Children and Family Ministry.
3. As soon as God brings that person to us and that person is ready, we will bring them on board.

It is a pleasure to serve you and to serve with you! Please be praying for our church, that God's kingdom will come, on earth as it is in heaven.


Current COVID guidelines:

# Ministry Partner Update

Each month, we will highlight updates from our domestic and global ministry partners. Many of these partnerships have been formed through congregational involvement and relationships, and are financially supported through the annual benevolences of St. Timothy's Lutheran Church.

## NALC DISASTER RESPONSE

In the fall of 2020, St. Timothy's joined the seven other churches in our Central Pacific Mission District to become an active member of the NALC Disaster Response Team. Led by the National Coordinator, Mary Bates, our district has been learning how we can effectively respond to disasters on campus and in our local area.

One aspect of our response is collecting disaster relief supplies such as: cleaning items, hygiene kits, diapers, school supplies, blankets, and Bibles. In May, our council approved St. Timothy's storing our area's disaster relief supplies. As the largest church in our district, it is a privilege to be able to support this ministry. Over the next few months, we are expecting the arrival of a 20' trailer that will be parked in the empty lot over by the Carter parking lot. We hope to fill this trailer to the brim with disaster relief supplies! Stay tuned to learn how you can help.

NALC Disaster Response also includes:

- Mission trips to active disasters
- Servant events at the warehouse in Caldwell, Ohio
- Community Disaster Preparedness Training, held at Holy Cross, Pacifica this October
- Family and Church Preparedness, including creating Survival Kits and updating our church's Emergency Response Plan
- Installing an AED to be more readily prepared for a medical emergency on campus
- A team of prayer warriors to support those involved in any disaster

This past year has involved much research, many emails, and plenty of Zoom calls between our district churches. We have learned a lot! Be on the lookout for more ways to help as we start to put some of these plans into action!



## SOUTH VALLEY FISH FOOD PANTRY

The South Valley FISH Food Pantry ("FISH") started up on our St. Timothy's campus back in October of 2016. Our mission quickly outgrew our pantry space in Carter and moved to our current, Camden Ave., location in A1, A2 and A3 in September of 2019. Demand for our services dramatically increased when the COVID-19 pandemic began, and shelter-in-place orders went into place in the Bay Area. Prior to the pandemic, we served on average 28 families per week, and now, we are serving an average of 45 families per week – with new families coming each week.

Exciting news for our FISH ministry is the upcoming renovation project. Thanks to our generous supporter, later this month, we will begin construction to open up the interior walls between our three rooms to allow for easier flow. In addition, we are updating our flooring to remove the carpet, adding a more durable water-proof laminate and upgrading our shelving and freezer storage.

It takes many helping hands to keep our operation going each week. Averaging 30 volunteers weekly, FISH is able to meet the growing demand from our community. Volunteer positions include the following: restocking shelves, prepping the bags of food, picking up food from Trader Joe's and Smart & Final (grocery rescue program), picking up food at Second Harvest, distribution, shopping and callers (returning client calls). We are truly blessed to have so many amazing helping hands, and can always use more.
