SCHOLARSHIP

We are pleased to announce that St. Timothy's Lutheran Church is again offering Legacy Fund scholarships to recent high school graduates. Scholarship recipients will receive \$1000 toward college tuition and fees, with payment made directly to the student.

ELIGIBILITY FOR SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

The following criteria must be met to qualify for scholarship award under the program:

- 1. The applicant must be affiliated with an NALC congregation within the Central Pacific Mission District.
- 2. The applicant must have graduated from high school within the past two years and must have either started their first year of post-secondary school during 2021 or be planning to start no later than April 2022.
- 3. The applicant may not have previously received a scholarship under the program.
- 4. The applicant must return an application package (application form, an attached essay, a copy of the acceptance letter or proof of admittance from the school, and a letter of reference).

Ministry Partner Update

Each month, we will highlight updates from our domestic and global ministry partners. Many of these partnerships have been formed through congregational involvement and relationships, and are financially supported through the annual benevolences of St. Timothy's Lutheran Church.



St. Timothy's became a part of the newly-formed NALC in 2011, after a season of discernment to determine which denomination might better align with our values. The NALC's care for the authority of Scripture and affirmation of women clergy were among the values which contributed to this affiliation.

What was anticipated to be a small denomination in its conception, has continued to grow over the years, stretching the minimalist structure thin. Cautious of a top-heavy and onerous structure, the NALC has slowly integrated additional positions to support the congregational need. To that end, the 2021 Convocation of clergy and lay delegates in Corpus Christi, Texas, offered a strong vote of support for the implementation of four Regional Assistants to the Bishop. These regional assistants will support Bishop Dan in his leadership and care of pastors in the more than 450 congregations in the NALC.

As Bishop Dan shared in his sermon at St. Tim's a few months ago, the NALC has focused their efforts into a ten-point 2020 Vision. This vision includes a plan of action with department leads in the areas of: Disciple-Making, Congregational Multiplication, Pastoral Support, Continuing Education, Continental Restructuring, the Seminary System, Technology and Communication. Ecumenical Relationships, Financial Strength, and Strategic Planning.

We are thankful for the work of God through the NALC and our partnership in it.



St. Timothy's voted to become associated with LCMC at our Annual Congregational Meeting in January, 2021. As you may notice in the name, LCMC is not a denomination, but is an association of churches who ascribe to similar values. That being the case, St. Timothy's was able to join LCMC without compromising our commitment to the NALC. (Quite a number of churches are dual-affiliated with the NALC and LCMC, in fact.)

As our Leadership Council considered this opportunity to dual-affiliate, there were a number of considerations which encouraged this recommendation. One of the considerations was for future Call Teams – affiliating with LCMC increases the pastoral candidacy pool. Another consideration was that before coming to St. Timothy's, Pastor Jim was the chair of the LCMC Ministry Board, and in order to continue would need to be a part of an LCMC congregation. (The council wanted to encourage the continuation of that ministry for Pastor Jim.) A third consideration was a greater network of sister congregations, partnering in ministry to advance the work of the kingdom of God.

We look forward to seeing what the Holy Spirit will do with this new affiliation, as we join LCMC's Annual Gathering every other year, and partner with sister congregations in ministry.
