Happy New Year! We of course have no idea what the new year will bring, but we do know that we are in the hands of God who loves us and takes care of us. That is wonderful assurance. With that assurance we seek to live our lives in the goodness of God's love and grace.

One of the texts from the Bible that creates a deep yearning in my soul comes from Luke 24:27 "And beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, he explained to them what was said in all the Scriptures concerning himself." Wouldn't it be amazing to learn from Jesus the deep truths throughout the scripture? I certainly think so. Where then does that leave us? We have the Bible and all that the Holy Spirit reveals to us in it.

I have found that having God's Word in my heart and mind each day tunes my heart to the Holy Spirit's promptings. I believe that we can indeed hear the voice of God in and for our lives through the Bible. This is why we are launching the "Hearing God's Voice" initiative for 2022. This initiative has a daily reading plan that takes us through the Old Testament once and the New Testament twice in the year.

This is really a reading plan more than a Bible Study plan. In the approximately 4 chapters to be read each day, you

pray for the Holy Spirit to make one verse (or thought) capture your attention. Then using the SOAP method of journaling you look closer at the verse and ask God what He is trying to say to you in it. You finish journaling by praying for God's strength and help to live out what you have found there.

The final step in this process is then to connect with someone in your life to talk about it. This conversation helps both you and them to be more aware of and confident in God's movement in your life.

Marilyn has the powerful experience of having been asked to share her SOAPing experience. The immediate thought that came to her mind was "living in the Promises of God." The journey through the scripture created in her an abiding sense of God's faithfulness and a strength of conviction that she could live in the assurance of God's promises.

The journey of St. Tim's through 2022 will no doubt bring our faith community this same confidence, assurance and strength of faith. I am excited to see what God will do in and through us as we hear and respond to His daily voice in our lives.

Read through the Bible in a Year with S.O.A.P.

"How to S.O.A.P."

S.O.A.P. is an acronym for Scripture-Observation-Application-Prayer. It is a journaling method to memorialize our daily reading of Scripture. Daily devotions (reading and journaling) is a great spiritual discipline to assist you in your walk with Christ. All that is needed is a Bible, writing instrument, and paper. You can save your journals and review them periodically to see how God is speaking to you over time.*

Scripture As you read the chapters for each day, ask the Holy Spirit to prompt you through God's Word. Take your time reading and allow God to speak to you. When you are done, look for a verse that stood out to you, and write that **Scripture** verse in your journal.

Observation Write down what you think God is saying to you in this verse. Look before and after the verse seeking to understand what it is communicating. In your journal next to the letter "O," write out this **observation** in your own words.

Application Ask yourself how this verse applies to your life right now. Perhaps it is instruction, encouragement, revelation of a new promise, or a correction for a particular area of your life. Next to the "A," write out how this idea can be **applied** to your life.

Prayer This is a **prayer** to ask God to help you live out what has been revealed to you in this time. Remember, prayer is a two-way conversation, so be sure to listen to what God has to say! Write it out next to the "P". You may also write down other concerns that come to mind that you want to give over to God's keeping.

*There are journals and bookmarks with the readings in the church entryway. If you have not gotten one yet, please pick one up at worship.

The St. Timothy's Legacy Fund is a resource that has been built up from planned gifts, typically from members of this congregation or their estates, that is separate from the church budget. Again this year, the Leadership Council authorized scholarship awards from the earnings of this fund to recent high school graduates from congregations within the NALC Central Pacific Mission District of which we are a part.

We are pleased to announce that a Legacy Fund Scholarship in the amount of \$1,000 has been awarded to Dylan Wagner to assist him with fees and expenses as he furthers his education at University of the Pacific. Dylan is the son of Jeff and Sara Wagner and has been very much shaped by his experiences at St. Timothy's. He was a student at the school from preschool through the fifth grade, was active in our youth group and Mexico-Mission Team, and participated in our worship team. The latter experience was an influence in his choosing to pursue a degree in Music Industry Studies.

We want to share with you an excerpt from the essay that was a key part of Dylan's scholarship application: "The support from St. Timothy's and its community have been paramount in forming who I am today. I have so many wonderful people that have done wonderful things in my life and the lives of others that I can look to as examples of how to carry myself, with God as my light. St. Timothy's is where I have grown up and its community has motivated me to try to have a heart of service, gratitude, and faith."

Ministry Partner Update

Each month, we will highlight updates from our domestic and global ministry partners. Many of these partnerships have been formed through congregational involvement and relationships, and are financially supported through the annual benevolences of St. Timothy's Lutheran Church.

Correctional Institutions Chaplaincy

Pastor Judy has been our boots on the ground chaplain with CIC since 2017, a ministry which provides spiritual support for each incarcerated person in Santa Clara County. In August, CIC was able to host their first in-person volunteer chaplain training since the jails suspended in-person programming due to COVID-19. Chaplain Angel Hernandez, Associate Director and Facility Chaplain at Elmwood Men's recounted this story:

"One time in December, I went to Elmwood for some visits. I had to use the visitor phones since contact visiting was still not an option due to COVID. Men would tell me their hurts, some would tell me their joys, some would only be emotional. I listened, watched and tried to let them know that they can keep doing what they feel they need to while I am there. If it's more tears, cry. If it's more story, share. Because of limited access, some people were only seen once.

A few weeks ago, I received a request to visit an individual. He walked into the room and sat down. He was winded. As he began to talk, he wept and stuttered. I let him know that there was no hurry, to catch his breath. He said, "One time in December, you came and saw me." He said, "You came in and staved as I shared about my life, my hurts, my current situation and my dreams." He continued, "I cried and you stayed, I yelled and you stayed, I laughed and you stayed." He said, "I would have left, but you stayed and I was able to keep sharing and started believing in myself." He wanted to say thank you. He also insisted, "Don't stop coming in. There are many people like me who need people like you to come and sit with us, to hear us, to lift us up, to empower us, to bring us back."

ONE TIME with an individual can change their life.

Convalescent Hospital Ministry

CHM has many from St. Tim's that provide ministry to those convalescing in care facilities. President, Ida Stickland, wrote this update and word of thanks:

In 2020 and part of 2021, nursing homes were closed and CHM was not able to send teams in for services. During that time, team members did their best to keep in touch with residents with cards, gifts of activity books and magazines and occasional cookies to the staff.

This past summer, one of our teams was able to return to regular ministry at Mission Skilled Nursing in Santa Clara. And in October, Almaden Care and Rehab allowed our team to start services. We were able to serve communion for the first time at the request of the residents! We've not been able to go on a regular schedule because the facility has had several quarantine periods that have conflicted with service times.

At Almaden, the activity director asked for donations of small gifts for the residents, most of whom have no family. Our appeal to churches was very successful. Gift bags were distributed to the residents. Also, CHM has provided funds for special gifts of sweatshirts that were needed. We're hoping to be able to fund some needs at other facilities as well.

We are in the process of finding other nursing homes that would like services brought in to them. We will need a major drive in 2022 to find volunteers to help at these facilities, since many of our past volunteers are not available to us after this length of time.

The CHM board is so appreciative of the support we've received during this difficult time and we're looking forward to what God has for us in the new year!
