
Our longing finds a home in the season of Advent. It is a season of anticipation, beauty, mystery, pain, and most importantly, hope.

Ministry Partner Update

Each month, we will highlight updates from our domestic and global ministry partners. Many of these partnerships have been formed through congregational involvement and relationships, and are financially supported through the annual benevolences of St. Timothy's Lutheran Church.

Mercy Mobile

Since November 2014, St. Timothy's has had a fruitful relationship with the CHAM Mercy Mobile and Pastor Scott Wagers. Mercy Mobile delivers desperately needed clothing, food, and supplies to the homeless, and it's bringing attention to the homelessness crisis in our community.

Our congregation supports this life-changing ministry by financial support and donations including blankets, tents, clothes, hygiene kits, food and other necessities. Numerous St. Timothy's members, including our youth, volunteer to distribute these donations to various encampments and have witnessed the reality of homelessnessthroughout Silicon Valley.

In addition to serving the homeless community, Mercy Mobile began a campaign to educate church groups, students, the press, athletes, politicians, and anyone who is interested in learning the reality of homelessness in our city. Their work has inspired other churches and organizations to create mobile services for the unhoused such as portable showers, clothes closets, and laundry services.

We ask you to pray for Mercy Mobile, that God will guide and strengthen them as they continue to create new, effective homeless ministries to meet the challenges posed by today's growing crisis.

CityTeam Ministries

CityTeam's mission is to share Christ's unconditional and redemptive love by caring for the immediate needs of thousands of men, women, and children struggling with food insecurity, homelessness, domestic violence, and other life disabling circumstances and behaviors.

St. Timothy's continues to support CityTeam with financial gifts and donations, and our members continue to be the hands and feet of Jesus by sharing their spiritual gifts through many volunteer opportunities. Some of those opportunities include serving hot meals to those who are homeless and hungry, conducting Bible studies, and serving as spiritual mentors to men and women who are in recovery. Our congregation was blessed to provide an additional financial gift this year to assist City Team in the acquisition of Grace Village Apartment Complex. The complex will add 50 apartments and provide much-needed transitional, supportive housing for vulnerable women and children in the Bay Area.

Here are some of their accomplishments over the past twelve months:

- Acquisition of Grace Village Apartment Complex
- 10,000 meals provided daily to local communities
- 29 graduates completed one-year residential programs, achieved sobriety, secured stable housing and employment.
- 2,500 backpacks with a pair of shoes distributed to underserved youth in our community to start the school year.
- 34 mobile pantries serving families in need across the South Bay and the Peninsula.
- 8 pop-up closets providing clothes, coats and shoes to lowincome neighborhoods and schools.

God's work continues to shine through our partners at CityTeam.




Cantata Sunday, December 19 9:00 am and 11:00 am

Special Congregational Meeting

There will be a Special Congregational Meeting to vote on Constitution and Bylaw changes. Any changes to our Constitution requires two votes, so this will be the first vote. If it passes, the second vote with be at the Annual Meeting on January 30, 2022. The only business at the special meeting will be to vote on the changes to the two documents. The proposed changes are posted on St. Tim's Connect/Groups/ Church Emails/Files.

United Against the Poverty Pandemic

When the pandemic struck last year, our Leadership Council was keenly aware that business would not remain as usual. We wondered what the shutdown might mean for your work, what online and remote connections might mean for our church community, and what giving might mean for our anticipated hires and goals for 2020. What we didn't anticipate was that you would give so generously to the ministry of St. Timothy's! As a result, we knew that we would be able to extend a sizeable financial tithe, to a local or global organization in need.

We kept our eyes and ears open so that we could respond with a gift by the end of the year. We found out about United Against the Poverty Pandemic, an effort initiated by Healing Grove Health Center, the City of San Jose, and CityTeam, to name a few. This effort was to offer financial support to families at risk of becoming homeless in Santa Clara County, after the housing moratorium lifted on January 31, 2021.

Because of your generosity, we were able to contribute \$40,000 to the United Against the Poverty Pandemic initiative! As of September of this year, \$446,783 had been raised by churches, and a combined \$1.8 million from the government, corporations, churches, and individuals.

Shortly after the distribution of funds began, the housing moratorium was extended. It became clear to the UAPP board that the greatest need was to partner with extremely low-income individuals to extend meaningful employment and training through an initiative that became known as Project Nehemiah. This is what our contribution went to support.

Project Nehemiah operates under a two-month cohort structure, providing employment training through CityTeam and Healing Grove, janitorial work to three non-profits in the Washington Community of San Jose, and assistance for landing permanent jobs. As of October, three cohorts have completed Project Nehemiah. Pictured here is the graduation of the first cohort, supported by St. Timothy's, which achieved a 90% permanent job placement rate! After this third cohort, Healing Grove anticipates shifting to an unpaid employment training model, aiding workers to move from minimum wage jobs to living wage jobs. Finally, Healing Grove is working toward building an anti-poverty coalition, comprised of churches, faithbased non-profits, corporations, and government, working together to end poverty in the Silicon Valley.
