

Pastor's Pen

We have moved from winter into spring and the move from Lent to Easter is upon us. It is a movement from sin and death to forgiveness and new life. It is a movement from cold to warmth and from darkness into light. It is a movement from admission of our own weakness and shortcomings to the resurrection power of God and that power at work in our lives.

We are launching a new ministry following Easter. It is called GriefShare. It too is a movement from darkness to light, and from death to life. At the end of last spring, we had a worship series called "Out of Hibernation." It was intended to speak to the movement from the social distancing of the pandemic back into the connections of family and friendships. We long for the ability to reconnect with one another especially for the sense of belonging and connection that could bring comfort and strength to heal from the struggle and pain of the last couple of years.

I see this happening but I think we all hoped it would come more quickly. In the impatience and struggle of life that the people of Israel endured during the years in the wilderness, they often longed to go back to Egypt. And even in their sin and faithlessness, God propelled them forward into the promise. It was not an easy journey, yet God proved faithful.

As we move into the season of Easter and are renewed in God's resurrection power, we too will see and can anticipate God's faithfulness. God works to reconcile. God works to bring us together as his children both for our sake and for the sake of the world. I pray that you will see His mighty hand at work in your life and relationships and at work in our congregation. I pray that you will sense God's calling to engage with your gifts and love so that the connections so deeply needed will be strengthened and new relationships will be experienced with joy and purpose.

Our journey together in worship will continue to grow out of the daily Bible reading focus: "Hearing God's Voice." During the weeks of Easter, we will look deep into the values of the God we worship and who has redeemed us in Christ Jesus. This will be a series on the Kingdom of God as preached and lived out in the life of our Savior and Lord.

It is with great joy that we anticipate the wonder of what God will do in and through us. It is wonderful to walk this journey as part of this community of God's faithful people at St. Tim's.



Our Support Group will be using a program called GriefShare, which combines 3 components: a video, small group conversation, and a private journal (called a workbook). It comes highly recommended, and we are pleased to be part of it. It's a 13-week course, in person, beginning April 21 (just after Easter). An evening course is being planned for the fall.

Members and non-members alike are welcome. Tell your friends! We want to do as God has called us to do: to care for one another, bearing one another's burdens.

MEAL MINISTRY

One of the effective avenues St. Timothy's has established to care for one another is its Meals Ministry. Through the simple act of delivering a meal to an individual or family in need, the love of Christ is spread in a tangible and practical way. While this is not an exhaustive list, we provide meals for St. Timothy's members who are experiencing the following:

- · Birth of a child
- Serious illness or surgery
- During times of crisis such as a death in the family

Volunteers provide a complete meal and deliver it to the recipient. The meal can be store bought, homemade, frozen or just about anything! The meal does not have to be fancy or gourmet. We attempt to accommodate allergies and food preferences. We strive to work out a schedule that benefits the recipient while working with the schedule of the volunteers.

WHAT IS MY COMMITMENT?

It can be years before a request comes in, or we could get three in one month. The only commitment you are making is to receive an email when a request comes in. It will then be up to you to decide if you will be able to help at that time.

Ministry Partner Update

Each month, we will highlight updates from our domestic or global ministry partners. Many of these partnerships have been formed through congregational involvement and relationships, and are financially supported through the annual benevolences of St. Timothy's. Thank you for your continued support of the ministry in and through St. Timothy's!



Today, you'll likely use water countless times – to drink, cook, shower, brush your teeth, and more – without worrying whether the water is safe. But more than 2.2 billion people around the world lack access to clean, safe water. Every day, millions of women and children walk more than three miles to collect water that is often contaminated and makes their families sick.

Water Mission has had the honor to partner with St. Timothy's Lutheran Church since 2014. Members of St. Timothy's have prayed actively, given generously, and walked for water! Due to this effort, thousands of people in developing countries have experienced safe water for the first time. Lives have been transformed in stunning ways.

Most recently, St. Timothy's has partnered with Water Mission Peru based in Iquitos. The Amazon River provides 20% of the world's fresh water, but 90% of its inhabitants lack access to safe water. The community of San Roque is incredibly isolated. Depending on the time of year and speed of the river, it takes 10-12 hours by boat to get there from the largest city. The approximately 1,600 people that call San Roque home have never had sustainable access to safe drinking water.

With the help of our friends at St. Timothy's, Water Mission is implementing a solar-powered water system that will treat the water from the source and make it safe to drink. Water Mission's Peruvian staff are spending thousands of hours in the community partnering with the locals so that this community will have a sustainable solution.

Thank you for all that you've done to support this work. St. Timothy's is a church that's making a transformational difference in lives throughout California, Peru, and all over the world. Because of partners like you, in 2021, more than 1 million people have access to safe water. In addition, 30,000 people received sanitation solutions, such as latrines at home, in their medical facilities, or at school. More than 90,000 people are benefitting from the health and protection that comes from hygiene solutions like handwashing stations and community training. With your help, we've also served more than 265,000 survivors of 10 disasters around the world.

We love our friends at St. Timothy's and look forward to what God has in store for the future!




MIDDLE AND HIGH SCHOOL


