

#### PASTOR'S PEN

We continue to look for ways to strengthen our worship and witness. With this aim, we are trying some things this fall that we hope will bless you and those whom you invite to worship with us on Sunday mornings. Beginning Sunday, September 11, there will be some things happening at different times and in different ways.

Here are some things we are shifting.

- The Traditional service will shift 15 minutes earlier to start at 8:45 am and will again use the liturgy from LBW setting two for a season. The Contemporary service will remain at 11:00 am.
- We will shift how we do communion. For a season, we will try doing continuous communion. This means that Holy Communion will be served at the center aisle (standing). This will allow those who wish to pray at the altar rail an unhurried time of prayer.
- The Nursery (during worship services) will be available for children from birth through Kindergarten. (CHILDREN ARE ALWAYS WELCOME IN WORSHIP!)
- We will reintroduce THE MIDDLE HOUR for all ages (preschool to adults). It will BEGIN AT 9:55 am. Choir will also rehearse during this hour. We will also continue to host a time of fellowship on the patio in the front welcome area.
- We are introducing Prayer Ambassadors. This is a team of people who will be available on Sunday morning to pray
  with those who desire it. This will happen in four ways: 1. If someone at the altar desires to have someone pray
  with them, they simply raise their hand for a moment and a Prayer Ambassador will join them. 2. Following the
  service a Prayer Ambassador will be at the front looking for anyone coming forward or remaining in the pew. Again,
  a simple raise of the hand will bring the Prayer Ambassador to them for prayer. 3. Prayer Ambassadors will also be
  on the patio looking for anyone who seems to be in need of prayer and will offer. And 4. Prayer Ambassadors will
  wear name tags and can be asked at any time for prayers.

We are very aware of the continuing Covid 19 infections in our area and welcome you to wear masks if you desire. We will continue to post videos of worship on the internet for those whose do not feel well or who simply which to remain in the safety of their home. However, we would love to have you in the sanctuary and as part of our worshipping fellowship, so make plans now starting September 11th to join us at either 8:45 or 11:00 am for worship together.
