## **2022** Mission Team

The Central Pacific Mission District's first mission trip for Disaster Response couldn't have been more wonderful. We had three Churches represented: Holy Cross Evangelical of Pacifica, St. Timothy's Lutheran, and Our Savior of Auburn.

Those from St. Timothy's included Assistant Youth Director, Scott Campbell, James Moore, Michael Stamos, and Victoria Thornton. Youth volunteers included four from the Camarena family, David, Hannah, Mary, and Gabriella, as well as Josh Weisshahn. Our fabulous cooking crew of Dan Centi, Don and Janis Haynes represented Holy Cross. The Kemper family represented Our Savior, Christine Kemper and her three sons, Christian, Daniel, and Andrew. Mary Bates, our National Coordinator and her husband Ken, flew out from Ohio to make our team complete.

Our host church for the week was that of Calvary Lutheran in Oroville. Their Congregation put out the red carpet for us, allowing us to use their commercial kitchen, and we had plenty of space for sleeping and activities in their generous Fellowship Hall.

The main project for the week was making the Lake Madrone area of Berry Creek more firewise for protecting property should they have another fire. We pulled dead trees and limbs through berry bushes and thorns into large burn piles. Even though it was 105 degrees out, no one complained. The Lake Madrone community was so thankful for our help that they prepared lunch for us each of the days we worked there, Monday through Wednesday.

Thursday, we worked at Our Savior Lutheran Church in Paradise which had lost their entire church building in the 2018 Paradise Fire. They have rebuilt their church, and needed help maintaining the grounds. Half of our group headed to Paradise Thursday and the other half remained at Calvary washing the windows, cleaning the playground area, and painting flower boxes and tables. Friday was finishing up the work at Calvary then visiting Old Town Oroville in the afternoon.

Each morning and evening we had devotions and spoke of the experiences we had during the day. It was truly amazing how the Holy Spirit was working the entire week with experiences the group had with others we came into contact with. Friendships were made within the group that will probably continue. The group disbanded after breakfast Saturday morning all agreeing it was one of their most moving experiences and a must to do again!
