Dear Friends,

The Calling of a new pastor to a church is always a moment to mark in the history of the congregation.

A Special Congregational meeting has been called for October 9 at 12:15 in the sanctuary for us to vote on the recommendation of Joe Hill for our next pastor. Only members present in person at the meeting are allowed to vote and a 2/3rds majority is required to extend the Call.

Here at St. Timothy's this Call takes on extra significance as the one being recommended by our Call Team has been raised up for this service through the ministry and influence of St. Tim's itself. And, it would bring not only an installation but an ordination into pastoral ministry.

Every pastor is asked to encourage the young people in their congregation to consider ordained ministry. This has happened over the years at St. Timothy's. Thanks be to God. We have other members at this time who are also considering ordained ministry and I hope we can successfully encourage them as they discern God's future for them.

With discipleship as a focus here at St. Tim's it is not a surprise that several people have looked closely at the possibility of going to seminary to prepare for serving Christ as a vocation. I hope that many others will do so. While all Christian are called and gifted to serve Christ and be a witness in their lives, ordained ministry is a setting apart of one to bear the responsibility of the ministry of Word and Sacrament. They are set apart to ensure the right preaching and teaching of God's Word to the people in line with the Creeds and Confessions of this church. They are Called to lead God's people by their own example in faithful service and holy living.

Ephesians 4:11-13 reads: "So Christ himself gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the pastors and teachers, ¹² to equip his people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up ¹³ until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ."

Please plan to gather with your fellow members to mark this significant moment in St. Timothy's history as we vote on October 9th.

Joe Hill and his family - Elizabeth, his wife, and two young daughters Avery (3) and Kayla (1) - are San Jose natives. He will begin his first call with 12 years of full-time ministry experience under his belt, including direct work in the areas of youth and young adult ministry, contemporary worship, and discipleship. He has a Master of Divinity from Fuller Theological Seminary along with continuing education courses taken at the Institute of Lutheran Theology and North American Lutheran Seminary. He also recently completed his pastoral internship at Christ Lutheran Church in Santa Clarita, Ca.

He has a passion for outreach, evangelism, discipleship, and raising up new leaders (especially young leaders) for the ministry of the Church, both within and outside the four walls of the local congregation. As a San Jose native, he has a heart for bringing Jesus to the Bay Area, one of the most non-churched locations in the country, and is excited about the opportunity to partner in ministry with St. Timothy's to grow in faith and reach others with the Good News of Jesus!





As a church, we have four different opportunities to bless children around the world.

1. We will be packing shoeboxes as a church November 9-13. Families and small groups can sign-up for a time to come in and pack shoeboxes as a small group. We will be collecting various items for the shoeboxes to provide the items before the packing party. 4. Finally, St. Timothy's is again a Drop-off Center on November 14-21 for other churches to bring their shoeboxes for us to pack and send on the next step of their journey.

THE WORD ON COMMISSIONED LIVING

Few things seem more hopeless than the aftermath of a devastating forest fire. Heat and flames leave an ashen and smoldering landscape wherein it's difficult to imagine life returning. But our Creator knows better, and he would encourage us to see the same. After the passing of winter, spots of bright green shoot up from the otherwise dark and barren terrain, bringing new life to a place that seemed so very dead. Our Creator, it would seem, is also a very capable Re-Creator.

The sinful and selfish ambitions of mankind have wreaked considerable destruction in our world. The social order is not what it ought to be. "In the last days," Paul wrote to Timothy, "there will come times of difficulty. For people will be lovers of self, lovers of money, proud, arrogant, abusive... brutal, not loving good." (2 Timothy 3:1-3) He painted a rather dreary picture of mankind, a landscape dark with hatred, oppression, and injustice, where it is difficult to imagine life and love thriving.

We may be tempted simply to condemn such a world, speaking yet more disparaging judgment and death to it. Sadly, this is all too often what we Christians do, failing to recognize our own complicity in the wrongness of the world around us. Even more unfortunately, we may miss the amazing things God wants to do in this world, and what he wants to do, and indeed already has done, in us.

God "saved us," Paul wrote, "not because of works done by us in righteousness, but according to his own mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewal of the Holy Spirit, whom he poured out on us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that being justified by his grace we might become heirs according to the hope of eternal life. The saying is trustworthy, and I want you to insist on these things, so that those who have believed in God may be careful to devote themselves to good works." (Titus 3:4-8)

Our Re-Creator God has graciously "regenerated" us, giving us the "hope of eternal life," and making us heirs of heaven. We are to live in this world not as those who hate or abuse, nor as those who disparage and condemn, but as those who do "good works." In the World Mission Prayer League, we accept as our commission to "act in accordance with God's mercy and justice, in advocacy for the weak and marginalized." As God's regenerated people, we are to be like "spots of green" bringing a bit of the heaven we await into the sin -charred world in which we live. How might you do that today? Let God show the way.

Dear Friends at St. Timothy's,

I would like to give you an update on our Mercy Mobile frontline outreach efforts. We have been distributing water, food, clothes, hygiene kits, socks and other supplies to several camps throughout San Jose at least three times a week.

The late summer heatwave was absolutely brutal for those living outside. Our teams distributed dozens of cases of water over the course of 12 days. There were several reports of unhoused people being overcome with heatrelated illness. 14 unhoused people have died so far in September in Santa Clara County— with those grim numbers likely to grow as the cold weather sets in.

The huge encampment by the airport is currently being swept by the city. Approximately 150 people still remain at the camp, and from what we have been seeing, the sweep is creating significant tension. We have been involved with this camp since it's beginning (around 2019), and we served the people there throughout the pandemic, up until the sweep began 2 weeks ago.

We know many of the people and we continue to do what we can to mediate between the city and the folks living there. Currently, residents of the camp are trying to organize their own "safe parking" on the ball fields off of Taylor street, while others are scattering, seeking refuge amid the foliage along the Guadalupe river.

Finally, I would like to extend a resounding and heartfelt thank you to all who have supported our frontline efforts throughout the years. We were able to buy an efficient transport van for the upcoming cold-weather months THANKS TO THE INCREDIBLE GENEROSITY OF OUR FRIENDS AT ST. TIM'S. With the new "Mini Mercy Mobile," we will be expanding our efforts because we have two interns from Santa Clara University, three student volunteers from San Jose State, and two new staff members.










MIDDLE AND HIGH SCHOOL
