Pastor's Pen

This Lenten season has been a true blessing to me. The topic "Lifestyle of Grace" has captured my imagination as I have seen over and over again in Scripture the understanding that God's grace carries with it the power to transform. This seems to grow in truth with a greater awareness and consciousness that grace is the state in which God places us as His children.

The powerful words of Ephesians 2:10 "For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do" have grown clearer and clearer through our Lenten journey. The first realization is that we are indeed God's handiwork. This is true in our birth. Psalm 139:10 "For you created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother's womb." This continues to be true throughout our lives. Romans 12:2 "Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing and perfect will." And 1 John 3:2 "Dear friends, now we are children of God, and what we will be has not yet been made known. But we know that when Christ appears, we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is." These words are clear that our calling in Christ is not one of ease. There is no greater power. There is also no greater honor.

Children's HopeChest is a Christian ministry organization bringing sustainable positive community transformation to impoverished communities through a "Survive, Thrive and Succeed" model. This model develops long-term community-to-community partnership relationships called CarePoints that encourage North American communities to walk alongside impoverished communities around the world. Our leadership realized that many of our local ministries and ministry support efforts, such as City Team, FISH, Mercy Mobile, Village House and others have been relational, but that our global ministries lacked this same relationship connection.

hopechest

Children's HopeChest offers a unique sponsorship program called the "Friendship Model." A "HopeChest Friend" is a caring person who commits to financially supporting the care center and building a relationship with young person at that center. A unique aspect of the Friendship Model is the young people in our CarePoint select their HopeChest Friend from among our registered congregation members. Being a HopeChest Friend and supporting a vulnerable young person is one of the most personal ways that you can make an impact on global poverty. Your \$45 monthly support provides:

- •Direct assistance for emotional, environmental, educational, and medical needs
- •Letter writing between young person and HopeChest Friend. This includes delivery and translation.
- •Discipleship classes providing opportunities for a believer to share Christ through word and deed

Another exciting aspect of a CarePoint partnership is that each partnering organization is invited for periodic visits to their CarePoint. We get the opportunity to meet our HopeChest Friends, as well as other community members, and see the community transformation resulting from of our partnership.

St. Timothy's has selected the Chapa CarePoint in Ethiopia as its partnership community. The community in the Chapa CarePoint struggles with accessing safe drinking water, malnutrition and infectious diseases, political corruption, poor health care and education and is severely affected by climate hazards such as seasonal flooding. Chapa also has an inordinate amount of orphaned and vulnerable young people. As part of the Chapa CarePoint, 79 young people are in need of "HopeChest Friends." The development plan for the Chapa CarePoint includes a timeline for self-sufficiency by the year 2030, which means that the commitment from St. Timothy's support would last approximately seven years.
