Pastor's Pen

"What are you giving up for lent?"

Maybe you've been asked this question before. Or maybe you've asked it to someone. Lent is the season of the Church Calendar between Ash Wednesday and Easter, and is often known for the practice many people make of fasting, or "giving up" something, for its duration. They give up chocolate, coffee, alcohol, or something else. But the point of giving up something isn't just that we would stop doing something, but that in doing so, it would create a space in our lives where, by His grace, God could work in us something new.

This lent at St. Timothy's, we will be doing something special with our evening Lenten services. Rather than having our pastors preach on Wednesday evenings, each week you will hear a story of God's faithfulness from a member of St. Timothy's. Someone joked with me, "Pastor Joe, does that mean you're giving up preaching for lent?" Not exactly! The point of this is not that the pastors *aren't* preaching during lent. It is rather about who *is*!


We want to lift up stories from within our church family so that you can hear and be encouraged by what God is

up to in the lives of the people that you often sit with in the pews. We want you to hear the kinds of stories you don't often hear in a church setting- of how God is active and working in the lives of normal people. Because we know that when God brings people to a church, He does so not just as consumers, but as people uniquely gifted with something to offer that can and will build up the rest of the church body. We believe it to a fundamental truth about a community of faith that each person is here for a reason, and each person has something to offer to build up the church!

Ephesians 4:16 says, "From him [Jesus] the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, grows and builds itself up in love, as <u>each part does its</u> work."

This lent, we will be built up by the stories of some of our own-voices that we do not often hear from- and I know that we will be greatly blessed from that! My prayer for you this lent is that you would spend this season asking God to show you what unique gifts and passions he has given you for building up the church and spreading the Good News beyond its four walls, and how you might use them!






