Pastor's Pen

Entering the month of Thanksgiving is a true blessing to me. It sets my heart right with the reminder of the priority of gratitude. Each year I am reminded of the Luke 17:11-19 Ten Lepers Cleansed reading for Thanksgiving. They respect the law by staying at a distance as they ask Jesus for mercy. Jesus sends them to fulfill the law by sending them to the priests and as they go they are cleansed. This is a beautiful miracle that shows the love and mercy of God even for those who were considered outcasts and unclean.

But for me, it is what follows that is so instructive for us. When the one Samaritan returns to thank Jesus and the other nine, who are presumably Jewish, continue on their way to do as Jesus had told them and show themselves to the priests; Jesus asks "Where are the other nine?" I want to answer on their behalf "they are doing what you told them to do."

Why would Jesus call into question this clear act of obedience? This is the question that I contemplate. And the blessing that is brought by this meditation is that gratitude is an important part of faith. Gratitude may even be more important than obedience, but if not, it certainly proceeds it and probably even moves us forward in it.

When we our brought by faith to glimpse the wonders God, we begin to realize that all of life is a blessing poured out upon us by our creator. The wonder of that blessing increases as we experience the undeserved mercy of God. We then with grateful hearts celebrate God's goodness and provision.

What a beautiful world we live in. It is certainly also filled with brokenness and struggle, but let us take these moments to notice and give thanks for the wonder and goodness of our God. Let us celebrate that goodness with one another and by our thanks draw attention to our God that He would receive thanks and glory in our hearts and gatherings.

A MESSAGE FROM OUR TREASURER, CHRIS COLLIER

St. Timothy's continues to be supported by generous giving by our congregation, however, we are modestly lower than our budgeted level as we have realized roughly \$40,000 of income from our investments, which is included in our Offerings & Other Income. Continued generosity is important to fund our operations and ministries. We continue to operate prudently and with sound oversight of our spending. We remain on budget as we have been able to offset increases in campus related maintenance activities and higher than planned utilities costs through lower spending in other areas. The Preschool continues to operate very well under our new director, Lori Thompson, who continues to lead our efforts providing quality education and is with a well-designed program. Our enrollment levels have been higher than anticipated and the administration has done a tremendous job of operating with a much lower level of cost and investment.




