God is good all the time. We can trust in God's goodness, faithfulness and love. When we experience the challenges ahead, we can lean into the growth that has come through our daily walk. We remember and give thanks for the faithfulness of God. We also lean on one another to see the amazing ways that we move into the future together. While we start today with only a partial view, the promptings of the Holy Spirit empower us to exceed these expectations.

St. Timothy's continues to be supported by generous giving by our congregation,

however, we are modestly lower than our budgeted level as we have realized roughly \$47,000 of income from our investments, which is included in our Offerings & Other Income. We anticipate a greater level of offerings during the final months of the year as we enter the holiday season, similar to prior years. Your continued generosity is important to fund our operations and ministries.

We continue to operate prudently and with sound oversight of our spending. We remain on budget as we have been able to offset increases in campus related maintenance activities and higher than planned utilities costs through lower spend in other areas. The Preschool continues to operate well. Administration has done a tremendous job of operating with a much lower level of cost and investment.


Cantata
