Pastor's Pen

The New Year's Resolution is something that often comes with this time of year. It makes sense at times like this to both look back on the past year, and ahead to the future year. And what so many folks do is resolve to do things better. I'll eat better. I'll go to the gym. I'll give up some bad habit or pick up some good one.

But it seems inevitable that the gyms that are packed the first week of January have returned to normal by the middle of February. The new diet incorporates a little more ice cream and fast food than it had a month ago. Something that begins with such force and enthusiasm so often ends with settling back into old habits and old ways. Unsurprisingly, this is a pattern we see over and over throughout the Scriptures. In Exodus 19, the Israelites commit themselves to God to obeying the Lord and keeping His covenant, but they fall into idolatry before Moses has even made it back down Mount Sinai. The entire book of Judges is about the cycle of God's people being unfaithful and suffering the consequences, crying out to God, being saved by God's appointed judge, and then recommitting themselves the Lord, only to repeat the cycle over and over again. Peter tells Jesus, "I would die for you," and then denies even knowing him 3 times... and all in the same day!

This may seem like an awfully cynical *Pastor's Pen*, but here's the thing... the good news of the Gospel is not and never has been about how faithful we are: it's about how faithful God is! In the face of our sin, unfaithfulness and selfishness, God remains faithful. His love does not waiver or falter. When the God reveals His name and his character to Moses on Mount Sinai, he says, "The Lord, the Lord, the compassionate and gracious God, slow to anger, abounding in love and faithfulness..."

In this new year, I won't tell you not to make New Year's Resolutions... I certainly will make some of my own. But my encouragement to you in this new year is to fix your eyes upon Christ and ground yourself in *his* faithfulness and steadfast love.

A voice says, "Cry out." And I said, "What shall I cry?" "All people are like grass, and **all their faithfulness is like the flowers of the field.** The grass withers and the flowers fall, because the breath of the Lord blows on them. Surely the people are grass. The grass withers and the flowers fall, but **the word of our God endures forever**." Isaiah 40:6-8

BUDGET REPORT

FROM OUR TREASURER, CHRIS COLLIER are modestly lower than our budgeted level as we have realized roughly \$82,000 of income from our investments that is not budgeted, which is included in our Offerings & Other Income. We anticipate a greater level of offerings during the month of December, similar to prior years. Your continued generosity is important to fund our operations and ministries.

We continue to operate prudently and with sound oversight of our spending. We remain on budget as we have been able to offset increases in campus related maintenance activities and higher than planned utilities costs through lower spend in other areas. The Preschool continues to operate well. Administration has done a tremendous job of operating with a much lower level of cost and investment.

GROW GROUPS are small gatherings of community that meet weekly to build friendships, open the Bible together, encourage and support one another as we grow as disciples of Jesus.


GROW GROUPS do not require you to be an expert in the Bible or the church, but is a safe place to ask questions, learn, and grow in the Word.

GRIEF


