And Ephesians 4:16 says, "From him [Jesus] the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, grows and builds itself up in love, as each part does its work."

This Lent, I want to encourage you to consider how God has gifted you, and commit to praying that God would give you opportunities to use your gifts to serve the church, share the Gospel, and serve those in our greater community. It is not a plan of *if* God can use you, *but* HOW! You are gifted, loved, and called to a life of purpose.

Mr. Moses is also a hard-working farmer, who in spite of his diligence, struggled to barely feed his family of 5.

As a result of the support and mentoring of the CarePoint staff, Mr. Moses and the other Chapa farmers have been able to improve their income and

family life by learning how to cultivate different crops 3 times per year using modern farming methods. They've been trained on how to prepare the soil, develop a plan, protect the plants, and save money by reducing costs.
