

PASTOR'S PEN

We are half way through 2025 and have spent the first 6 months of this year with *The Story*, a chronological re-ordering of the narrative of the NIV Bible text to walk us through the story of the Bible, from Genesis to Revelation. This has been an opportunity to revisit familiar stories, get a fresh look at how and where they fit in the timeline, but more importantly, to see how God has been at work in and through it all- in the human messiness that is all over the Old Testamentand how despite humanity's constant failings and faithlessness, God remained committed and faithful to His covenant and His people.

Now we are moving into the (often more familiar) New Testament narrative and the life of Jesus as told in the 4 Gospels, I want to encourage you not to lose sight not just of *what* we are doing but also *why* we are doing it. This point is not just to get through the chapter for the week. It is not about "checking the box" but rather about opening up our hearts and minds to be, in the words of 2 Timothy 3:16-17 taught, corrected, rebuked and trained in righteousness, so that we may be

thoroughly equipped for every good work. We read God's word because "it is alive and active, sharper than any double-edged sword" (Hebrews 4:12). We read it because Psalm 1 tells us that the one who delights in God's instruction is like a tree planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in season.

As we continue through *The Story*, don't just read the text. Spend time preparing your heart to have an encounter with God in His word. Expect that even when it doesn't feel like a profound experience in the moment, that knowing God's word just might be equipping you for something that God has in store in the day or week to come!

And lastly, Jesus tells us in Matthew 7 that "anyone who hears these words of mine is like a wise man who built his house on the rock," and it is echoed again in the letter of James- "Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it is."

DEADLINE TO APPLY JULY 11

We are pleased to announce that St. Timothy's Lutheran Church is again offering scholarships to recent high school graduates. Scholarship recipients will receive \$1000 toward college tuition and fees, with payment made directly to the student.

ELIGIBILITY FOR SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

The following criteria must be met to qualify for scholarship award under the program:

- 1. The applicant must be affiliated with an NALC congregation within the Central Pacific Mission District or an LCMC congregation in Northern California.
- 2. The applicant must have graduated from high school within the past two years and be planning to start or continue his or her post-secondary education during the 2025-2026 academic year.
- 3. The applicant may not have previously received a scholarship under the program.
- 4. The applicant must complete an online application package (application form, an essay, a copy of the acceptance letter or proof of admittance from the school, and a letter of reference). Submissions are due no later than 5 PM (PDT) Friday, July 11, 2025.
